inafter referred to as the "principal Order") is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Transfer of Parishes from Scheduled District No. II to Scheduled District No. III.

2. The parishes of Slough, Eton, and Eton Wick shall cease to form part of Scheduled District No. II and shall form part of Scheduled District No. III.

Movement into or within Scheduled District No. II for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) An animal may be moved into or within Scheduled District No. II to a slaughterhouse within such District with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate if the animal is, before the movement is commenced, marked by and at the expense of the owner in the manner described in Article 5 (2) of the principal Order. This provision shall be included in Part II of the principal Order.
- (2.) Nothing in this Article shall affect movement of animals into Scheduled District No. II under Article 3 of the principal Order.

Movement into or within Scheduled District No. III for certain purposes.

- 4.—(1.) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient—
 - (i.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved into Scheduled District No. III from premises outside any Scheduled District for breeding or dairying purposes; or
 - (ii.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved within Scheduled District No. III as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in Scheduled District No. III;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under the preceding paragraph (ii) shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same with the words "Occupation Licence." Such a Licence shall be retained by the person to whom it is granted, and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of July, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 4), and shall be

read with the Order mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and eleven.
