The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 17th July, from His Majesty's Envoy at Mexico, stating that the Official Journal of the 14th July publishes a Presidential Decree declaring the Ports of Naples and Venice, in Italy, to be infected with cholera:—

The Decree states that, until further notice, the ports of Tampico, Veracruz, and Progreso, in the Gulf of Mexico, will be the only ones open to receive cargo and passengers from places infected or under suspicion of being infected with cholera, and the Port of Coatzacoalcos, also in the Gulf of Mexico, will be open only to receive cargo from such places.

The Sanitary Authorities at these Ports are to be guided by the instructions to be issued to them by the Superior Board of Health, in the reception of vessels arriving from infected ports.

The Decree further states that the Declaration of the 12th of October, and the Supplementary Declaration of the 28th October, 1910, relating to districts infected with cholera are withdrawn, as the Government have no information of the existence of cholera in the places therein mentioned.
