WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 29th day of October, 1901, between His late Majesty King Edward VII. and His late Majesty the King of the Belgians, for the Extradition of Criminals, which Treaty was amended by a supplementary Convention concluded on the 5th day of March, 1907;

And whereas a further Convention was concluded on the 3rd day of March, 1911, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, amending Article 6 of the aforesaid Treaty, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, being desirous of amending the provisions of article 6 of the Treaty between Belgium and Great Britain of the 29th October,

1901, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, have named as their respective Plenipotentiaries, for this purpose, that is to say :

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, a Baronet of the United Kingdom, a Member of Parliament, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And His Majesty the King of the Belgians, Count de Lalaing, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of His Britannic Majesty;

Who, having reciprocally communicated their full powers, found to be in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The following article is substituted for article 6 of the Extradition Treaty of the 29th October, 1901:—

When a person shall have been extradited by one of the High Contracting Parties, that person, until he has returned to the country from which he had been extradited, or until he has had opportunity of returning to it, shall not be detained or brought to justice in the State to which he has been handed over for any crime or on any other charge whatever prior to the extradition, except those in respect of which the extradition has been accorded.

Neither shall that person, until he has had an opportunity of returning to the country from which he has been extradited, be handed over to a third State.

ARTICLE 2.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London, as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication in the manner prescribed by law in the respective countries, and shall have the same force and duration as the Treaty to which it relates.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention, and have affixed thereto their seals.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said benefice ’) of Yatton Keynell (otherwise Eaton Keynell), in the county of Wilts and in the diocese of Bristol.

“ Whereas by virtue of an indenture made the twelfth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and ten, between the Reverend Spencer Richard Arthur Buller, of the Rectory, Weybridge, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Edgar John Stanley Bolton, of Johannesburg, Esquire, of the one part, and the Right Reverend George Forrest, by Divine Permission Bishop of Bristol, of the other part, after reciting that the said Spencer Richard Arthur Buller and Edgar John Stanley Bolton were seised in fee simple of the advowson of the said benefice of Yatton Keynell as joint tenants, it was witnessed that in consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds paid to them, the said Spencer Richard Arthur Buller and Edgar John Stanley Bolton, by the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, the receipt of which was thereby acknowledged, the said Spencer Richard Arthur Buller and Edgar John Stanley Bolton, as beneficial owners, did thereby convey to the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of the said benefice of Yatton Keynell to hold the same unto and to the use of the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Bristol, in fee simple.

“ And whereas the said conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage or presen-

tation in the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, in right of his See, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise, may be required effectually to carry out that intention, may be done, and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council.

“ And whereas the said Spencer Richard Arthur Buller, Edgar John Stanley Bolton, and George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, are consenting to this scheme, the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, as party to the said indenture of the twelfth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and as Bishop of Bristol, the diocese wherein the said benefice of Yatton Keynell is situate, approving of and accepting the transfer of the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage or presentation as required by the Acts before mentioned or some or one of them.

“ And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Yatton Keynell which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Yatton Keynell.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Spencer Richard Arthur Buller and Edgar John Stanley Bolton (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Yatton Keynell shall be transferred to the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased

hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, “Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate

parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, Lord Bishop of Ely, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the county of Cambridge and diocese of Ely the benefice or vicarage of Wood Ditton, the parish whereof contains a population of one thousand and thirteen or thereabouts, with accommodation in the parish church for three hundred and ten, and in the chapel of Holy Trinity, Saxon Street, for one hundred and twenty persons.

"The net annual value of the said benefice of Wood Ditton from all sources is two hundred and fifty pounds, or thereabouts.

"There is in the same county and diocese the benefice or vicarage of All Saints, Newmarket, the parish whereof contains a population of four thousand five hundred, or thereabouts, with accommodation in the parish church for six hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said benefice of All Saints, Newmarket, from all sources, is two hundred and fifty-two pounds, or thereabouts.

"A certain portion of the said parish of

Wood Ditton situate within the civil boundary of All Saints, Newmarket, with a population of four hundred and fifty; or thereabouts; is distant about three and a half miles from the church of the said parish of Wood Ditton, but less than one mile from the parish church of All Saints, Newmarket.

"That the benefice of Llandebie is now held by the Reverend James Jones, and has a vicarage house or residence which will continue to be the vicarage house or residence of such benefice, and that the benefice of Bettws is now held by the Reverend John Walden Jones, and has

also a vicarage house or residence which will also continue to be the vicarage house or residence of that benefice.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Llandebie as well as of the benefice of Bettws is vested in me by virtue of my bishopric.

"That the gross annual value of the said benefice of Llandebie is £270 1s. 4d., and of the said benefice of Bettws £329 10s. 11d.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all persons interested.

"And I do submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of myself, as patron in right of my see, of the said benefice of Llandebie and Bettws, and of the Reverend James Jones, Incumbent of the benefice of Llandebie, and of the Reverend John Walden Jones, Incumbent of the benefice of Bettws.

"That your Grace may, if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the parish of Llandebie, in the county of Carmarthen, all that portion of the said parish being that

part of the urban district of Ammanford which is situate in the parish of Llandeibie and which is more particularly delineated and described in the map or plan attached hereto, being thereon coloured pink, and containing 550.183 acres or thereabouts, and to annex the same to the said adjoining benefice of Bettws in the said county of Carmarthen so that it may become hereafter for ecclesiastical purposes a part of such benefice of Bettws of which the parish church for the time being of the said benefice of Bettws shall be the parish church. That the said benefice of Bettws so enlarged shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice was subject to before being so enlarged.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Petroleum Act, 1871, that His Majesty may, from time to time, make, revoke, and vary Orders in Council directing that the said Act or any part thereof shall apply to any substance, and that the said Act or the part thereof specified in any such Order shall, during the continuance of the Order, apply to such substance, and shall be construed and have effect as if such substance had been included in the definition of Petroleum to which that Act applies, subject to the following qualifications:

1. The quantity of any substance to which this Act is directed by Order in Council to apply which may be kept without a licence, shall be such quantity only as is specified in that behalf in such Order, or if no such quantity is specified no quantity may be kept without a licence.

2. The label on the vessel containing such substance shall be such as may be specified in that behalf in the Order.

And whereas the Petroleum Act, 1879, and the Petroleum (Hawkers) Act, 1881, are to be construed as one with the Petroleum Act of 1871, and may, together with such Act, be cited as the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881.

And whereas Carbide of Calcium presents dangers similar to those presented by Petroleum.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above mentioned provisions of the Petroleum Act, 1871, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and pre-

scribe that the under-mentioned parts of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, shall apply to the said substance, Carbide of Calcium, in the same manner as if the said substance were Petroleum to which the Acts apply, viz.:—

The whole of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, except:—

(a) So much of section 6 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as specifies the nature of the label to be on the vessel, in lieu of which the label shall be as hereinafter provided.

(b) So much of section 7 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as relates to the exemption from such section of small quantities under certain specified conditions, and the quantity of Carbide of Calcium that may be kept without a licence shall be as hereinafter provided.

(c) So much of section 11 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as relates to the testing of samples taken by an officer of the Local Authority under the powers conferred by such section.

(d) So much of the Petroleum Act, 1879, as relates to the testing of Petroleum.

(e) So much of the Petroleum Act, 1881, as relates to the hawking of Petroleum.

The label on the vessel containing the said Carbide of Calcium shall bear in conspicuous characters the words "Carbide of Calcium," "Dangerous if not kept dry," and with the following caution: "The contents of this package are liable if brought into contact with moisture to give off a highly inflammable gas," and with the addition:—

(a) In the case of a vessel kept, of the name and address of the consignee or owner.

(b) In the case of a vessel sent or conveyed, of the name and address of the sender.

(c) In the case of a vessel sold or exposed for sale, of the name and address of the vendor.

The quantity of Carbide of Calcium that may be kept without a licence shall be as follows:—

1. Where the Carbide is kept in separate hermetically-closed metal vessels containing not more than 1 lb. each, 5 lb.

2. Where the following conditions are observed, 28 lb.

(a) The Carbide shall be kept only in a metal vessel or vessels hermetically closed at all times when the Carbide is not actually being placed in or withdrawn from such vessel or vessels.

(b) The vessels containing Carbide shall be kept in a dry and well-ventilated place.

(c) Due precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised persons from having access to the Carbide.

(d) Notice shall be given of such keeping to the Local Authority, and free access shall be afforded to their duly authorised inspector to inspect the portion of the premises where the Carbide is kept and the generator is situated.

Where a fixed generator is used on the premises:—

(e) There shall be exhibited near the generator a certificate signed by the maker or supplier of the generator, that the generator complies with the Regulations as to acetylene generators issued by the British Acetylene Association.

(f) Full and detailed instructions as to the care and use of the generator shall be kept constantly posted up in such place as to be conveniently referred to by the generator attendant.

3. Where the Carbide is kept by a General Lighthouse Authority, as defined by the Mer-

chant Shipping Act, 1894, such quantity as may be required for the purposes of such Authority, provided that:—

(a) The Carbide is kept only in a metal vessel or vessels hermetically closed at all times when the Carbide is not actually being withdrawn from such vessel or vessels.

(b) The vessels containing Carbide are kept in a dry and well-ventilated building exclusively appropriated to the keeping of Carbide, and detached from a dwelling-house or separated therefrom by a substantial partition with no opening in it.

(c) Due precautions are taken to prevent unauthorised persons from having access to the Carbide.

(d) No artificial light capable of igniting inflammable vapour is allowed to be taken into the building in which the Carbide is kept.

All previous Orders in Council relating to the keeping of Carbide of Calcium, viz., Orders dated 26th February, 1897, 7th July, 1897, and 24th October, 1904, are hereby repealed.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Constantinople, but of which it appears sufficiently clearly that they have another origin and which are packed in such a manner, and have been so transported that they cannot have been in contact with infected objects.

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or manipulation on the way.

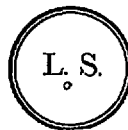
