DOCKYARD PORTS REGULATION ACT,
 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council adding a Clause to the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 29th June, 1888, respecting the Dockyard Port of Chatham and Sheerness.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Lancaster) Order, 1911.

Dated 1st September, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Lancaster, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of Lancaster) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Wild Duck, Snipe, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Lancaster to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Harrier (all species), Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Hobby,
