

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.

Parish of Crowborough.

To the County Council of East Sussex;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of East Sussex having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate within the Parish of Crowborough, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding

ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Parish of Crowborough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

SCHEDULE.

So much of Beacon Road as extends in a westerly direction for a distance of 100 yards from its junction with the cross roads at the Red Cross Hotel;

So much of Eridge Road as extends in an easterly direction for a distance of 100 yards from its junction with the cross roads aforesaid;

So much of London Road as extends from its junction with the cross roads aforesaid to its junction with Pilmer Road;

So much of Station Road as extends from its junction with the cross roads aforesaid to its junction with Croft Road at the Broadway.
