

granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(3.) A copy of a Licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughter-house specified in the licence in any case in which the slaughter-house is situate in another district.

(4.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

#### *Licences after Completion of Movement.*

8. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the said movement.

#### *Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

#### *Production of Licences; Name and Addresses.*

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### *Offences.*

11.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### *Interpretation.*

12. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### *Commencement.*

13. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

#### *Short Title.*

14. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER of 1911 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

##### *Zone No. I.*

The parish of Middlezoy.

##### *Zone No. II.*

The parishes of Walton, Pitney, High Ham, Huish Episcopi, Aller, and Stoke St. Gregory, and such portion of the petty sessional division of Bridgwater as lies to the south of the Somerset and Dorset Joint Railway line running from Glastonbury to Bridgwater and to the east of the Great Western Railway line running from Bridgwater to Taunton (except the parish of Middlezoy).

##### *Zone No. III.*

The petty sessional divisions of Bridgwater (except such portions thereof as are included in Zones I and II), Wells (including the borough of Glastonbury, but excepting the parishes of Walton and Chewton Mendip), Somerton (except the parishes of Pitney, High Ham, Huish Episcopi, and Aller), Yeovil, Crewkerne, Ilminster (including the borough of Chard), Taunton (except the parish of Stoke St. Gregory), and Bishops Lydeard (excluding the parishes of Lydeard St. Lawrence and Toland);

The parishes of Berrow, Lympsnam, Loxton, Compton Bishop, Axbridge, Cheddar, Nyland-cum-Batcombe, Wedmore, Mark, Chapel Allerton, Weare, Badgworth, Biddis-ham, East Brent, Brent Knoll, Burnham, Burnham Without, Highbridge North, High-bridge South, Croscombe, Shepton Mallet, Pilton, Pylle, East Pennard, West Bradley, Hornblotton, Ditcheat, Ansford, Castle Cary, Alford, Lovington, Wheathill, North Barrow, South Barrow, Sparkford, Weston Bampfylde, West Buckland, Bradford, Oake; and

The boroughs of Bridgwater, Taunton, Wells, and Yeovil.
