ROMFORD RURAL DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order, dated the twenty-second day of September, 1911, the Local Government Board have confirmed an Order made on the 25th day of July, 1911, by the Rural District Council of Romford, in pursuance of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of Animal Charcoal manufacturer, Blood drier, Cat gut manufacturer, Fat melter or Fat extractor, Fish Skin dresser, Glue maker, Size maker, Gut scraper, Leather dresser, manufacturer of Manure from fish offal, blood or other putrescible animal matter, and Tanner, within the rural district of Romford to be an offensive trade.
