

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH OCTOBER 1911.)

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER
OF 1911 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Restriction on Movement of Dogs and of
Poultry in Zone 1.*

1.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to be at large within the Zone 1 described in the First Schedule to the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).

(2.) Within such Zone all live poultry shall be confined by the owner or person in charge thereof in a pen or like enclosure.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order, the expression "poultry" includes domestic fowls, turkeys, geese, ducks, and guinea-fowls.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 4).

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-
MENT ACT, 1907.

THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF NEW MILLS.

NOTICE.

THE Local Government Board having, by an Order dated the 25th September, 1911, declared certain parts and sections of the above Act to be in force within the above-named district, notice is hereby given, that the effect of the said Order is, subject to the conditions and adaptations hereinafter mentioned, shortly as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which the Order comes in operation—sections 15 to 25 (inclusive) and sections 27 to 33 (inclusive), comprised in Part II; sections 43, 44, 47 and 50, comprised in Part III; Part IV; and Part V of the said Act shall be in force in the district.

(2) Certain conditions and adaptations of the above, mentioned in the Schedule, are to apply until further order.

ARTICLE II contains directions as to advertising the Order.

ARTICLE III.—The Order to come into operation on the 13th November, 1911.

EPITOME OF THE SCHEDULE.

PART II.

Section Twenty-five. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connexion with dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exercisable."

Section Twenty-seven. "(7) Not to apply to Territorial Force."

Section Thirty. "Not to apply to wall supporting street or footpath by reason of surface of the street or footpath being above or below level of the surface of adjoining land (except in certain events)."

PART IV.

Section Fifty-nine. "(6) Not to apply to a Library not within the district."

PART V.

Section Seventy-five. "(3) The date of the Order for this part to be the beginning of the period for which the Local Authority shall give notice under subsection (1) of this section."
