

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH NOVEMBER 1911.)

NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1.) Article 3 (*Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets*) of the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911, and the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, shall, in respect of swine intended to be moved into the city of Newcastle-upon-Tyne from any market, fair-ground, saleyard, or specially authorised lairs in any of the Scheduled Areas described in the First Schedule to the first mentioned Order, be modified in manner shown in this Order.

(2.) The swine may be moved to any bacon factory or slaughter-house in the city or to any lair, market, or saleyard, authorised or licensed by the Local Authority of the city under any Order of the Board, and the licence for the movement of the swine may provide accordingly.

(3.) Swine so moved to a lair may be moved

only to a bacon factory or slaughter-house, or to a market or saleyard licensed by the Local Authority under the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906.

(4.) Swine moved to a market or saleyard may be moved only to a bacon factory or slaughter-house.

(5.) The movement from a lair, market, or saleyard in the city of Newcastle-upon-Tyne is subject to the following provisions:—

(i.) The swine must be marked in the manner described in Article 2 of the last mentioned Order;

(ii.) The swine must be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city; and

(iii.) The movement must be in accordance with the provisions of the last mentioned Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1911.
