WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commis-sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Act of the second and third years of the late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representa-tion, bearing date the nineteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate in the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Christ Church, Chadderton, in the county of Lancaster and in

the diocese of Manchester. "Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly repre-sent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The

District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Chadderton.' "And with the like consent 'of the said Edmund Arbuthuott, Bishop of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as afore said, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid, and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of-

any fee for the performance of the said office .

of baptism or for the registration thereof. "We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:

"The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Chadderton, being :---All that part of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Christ Church, Chadderton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the south-east by the new parish of Hollinwood, upon the south partly by the parish of Failsworth and partly by the parish of Saint Mary, Moston, upon the south-west by the last-named parish, upon the west and upon the north-west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Middleton Junction, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side—that is to say, upon the north-east—by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Middleton Junction, from the said new parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, crosses the middle of the Rochdale Canal, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of forty-one chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries White Gate Lane across such canal and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of White Gate Lane for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading between Yew Tree Farm and Yew Trees Farm into Coalshaw Green Road, and extending thence first castward and then in various directions along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Coalshaw Green Road and with the footpath leading under the Hollinwood Branch Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the Glebe Mills, and extending thence south-east-ward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the gateway leading into the Glebe Mills, and extending thence first northward, then south-eastward, then northward, and then again south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the premises attached to the Glebe Mills for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the south-western side of Canal Street, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Canal Street for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, from the said new parish of Hollinwood.'

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the
