

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF SURREY.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Surrey have made applications to the Local Government Board for regulations to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following parts of roads within the parishes of Fetcham and Great Bookham, in the rural district of Epsom, that is to say:—

In the parish of Fetcham:—

So much of Fetcham Street as extends from a point 100 yards north-west of its junction with New Road to a point 100 yards south-east of that junction; and

So much of New Road as extends from a point 100 yards north-east of its junction with Fetcham Street to a point 100 yards south-west of that junction.

In the parish of Great Bookham:—

So much of Great Bookham Street as extends in a northerly direction for a distance of 500 yards from its junction with the main road from Leatherhead to Guildford;

So much of Lower Road, Great Bookham, as extends from a point 180 yards west of its junction with Great Bookham Street to a point 70 yards east of that junction.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or before the 27th day of December, 1911.

A copy of any such objections should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council, addressed to the Clerk to the County Council of Surrey, County Hall, Kingston-upon-Thames.

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE)
REVOCATION ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of any Order in force relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease in the county of Somerset are hereby revoked, and any Notices served thereunder by an Inspector of the Board are hereby withdrawn.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of December, nineteen hundred
