(1 and 2 Geo. V, c. 55.)

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JANUARY 1912.)

BIRMINGHAM (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Swine into City of Birmingham.

1. Nothing in this Order shall affect, or require a Movement Licence for, movement from

outside the City by railway to a station in the City, but for movement from the station such Movement Licence shall be necessary as is hereinafter prescribed.

Movement of Swine from or to Premises in the City of Birmingham.

2. Subject to the preceding Article swine shall not be moved from or to any premises in the City unless they are accompanied, while being moved in the City, by a Licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City or by a Licence authorising the movement granted under the Swine Fever Order of 1908 or the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Special Facilities for Movement of Swine to the Corporation Market.

3. Where under any Order made or to be made by the Board swine may be moved to a bacon factory or to a slaughterhouse in the City subject to a condition as regards a Licence authorising such movement or to any other condition, swine may, unless the movement is expressly prohibited by the Order, be moved, subject to the like condition, to the Corporation Market, and any swine so moved may be moved from the said market to a bacon factory or slaughter house, or to licensed lairs in the City, subject to, and in accordance with, the provisions of this Order. A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Market Superintendent, Moat Lane, Birmingham.

Movement of Swine from Corporation Market for Slaughter only.

- 4.—(1) Swine shall not be moved from the Corporation Market, except to a bacon factory or slaughter-house, or to licensed lairs in the City, and unless they are accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City and the movement shall be subject to the following conditions (namely):
 - (i.) The swine shall before movement be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse or lairs specified in the Licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.

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- (iii.) The Licence shall be in force for eight days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse or lairs to which the swine are to be moved.
 - (iv.) The Local Authority of the City shall cause a copy of the Licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate in any case in which that place is outside the City.
 - (v.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.
 - (vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence and are duly slaughtered there.
 - (vii.) Swine moved under this Article to licensed lairs in the City shall not be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to the Corporation Market; and unless they are accompanied by the Movement Licence required by this Order.
- (2.) Swine while being moved under this Article shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

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Movement into City from Markets, etc., in certain Counties.

5.—Notwithstanding anything contained in the Warwickshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1908, or the Cheshire, Shropshire, and Staffordshire (Swine-Fever) Orders of 1910, or the Worcestershire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1911, the place of destination of swine moved from a market, fair ground or sale yard under any such Order with a Licence (Form C) into the City need not be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and accordingly swine may be so moved with a view to their detention and isolation in accordance with the Order as hereby modified.

Movement for Shipment.

6.—(1.) Swine may be moved from premises in the City to any vessel for shipment, or to any premises in Great Britain for detention until shipment and thence to a vessel, if the swine during such movement are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement, which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City, but only if in his opinion the granting thereof is necessary or expedient.

(2.) Swine while being moved under this Article shall be exempt from any restriction on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Modification of Swine-Fever Order of 1911 as to Cleansing and Disinfection of Market Carts for Swine.

7. Paragraph (1.) of Article 6 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1911 shall in relation to the conveyance of swine to the Corporation Market by any carrier licensed for that purpose by the Corporation of the City, be modified so as to require only cleansing and disinfection each day after completion on that day of the use of the vehicle or thing for conveyance of swine to the said Market.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8. Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any premises except the Corporation Market, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Granting of Movement Licences.

-(1.) A movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(2.) A Movement Licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it:

is undesirable to grant it.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permit-ting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as afore-said, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed

guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig for the purposes of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-

"The City" means the City of Birming-

ham.

"The Corporation Market" means the Corporation Pig Market, Montague Street, in the City, and includes the slaughter-houses and lairs forming part of the Market:

"Licensed lairs" means lairs licensed under this Order or any other Order of the Board to be used for swine intended for

immediate slaughter.
"Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:

"Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector: "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

14. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order and any Regulations which prohibit or regulate movement of swine within the City are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the BIRMINGHAM (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1912.
