

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Ilkeston, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Ilkeston.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Charles Mollan Williams, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Ilkeston, shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Charles Mollan Williams, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, Ilkeston, being:—All that part of the parish of Ilkeston, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell, which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Trowell, in the county of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Southwell, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west, and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Trowell from the said parish of Ilkeston at a point in the middle of the River Erewash due east of the centre of the bridge which crosses the Erewash Canal at the southern end of Soughclose Lock, and extending from the said point in a straight line due west for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the centre of the said bridge, and extending thence first westward along the middle of such bridge and then first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Green's Lane for a distance in all of twenty-six chains and a half

or thereabouts to the junction of Green's Lane with Park Road, and extending thence first north-westward, and then south-westward along the middle of Park Road for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Nottingham Road on the eastern side of White Lion Square, and extending thence westward across White Lion Square for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the junction of Derby Road with Stanton Road, and extending thence generally southward along the middle of Stanton Road for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Little Hallam Lane, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Little Hallam Lane for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading into Corporation Road near its junction with Thurman Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Corporation Road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Corporation Road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hadley Street, and extending thence south-eastward first along the middle of Hadley Street and then in a straight line in continuation thereof (thereby crossing the Erewash Canal) for a distance in all of sixteen chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Erewash, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Ilkeston from the said parish of Trowell."

And whereas the said representation has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the Authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the said representation, and do order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts, and do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.
