WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission, dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Awliscombe is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in certain trustees upon trust in the first place for the Most Noble Herbrand, eleventh Duke of Bedford, a Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter (hereinafter called ‘ the said Duke of Bedford ’) for his life, and the said Duke of Bedford is therefore the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

“ And whereas the said Duke of Bedford is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Awliscombe should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of Exeter, in right of his See.

“ And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Awliscombe which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Awliscombe.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Duke of Bedford, being the person whose consent as patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Awliscombe shall be transferred to the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Archibald, Bishop of

Exeter, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Herbert Dobinson under the following circumstances:—

On the 26th of July, 1911, a serious explosion took place at an Explosives Factory belonging to Messrs. Curtis's and Harvey Limited,

at Cliffe, in the county of Kent, resulting in the death of three men and serious injury to three others. The explosion took place in one of the nitro-glycerine washing and filtering houses a few minutes after Dobinson had left the building. He was knocked down by the force of the explosion, but heard a fellow workman named J. Wordley call for help. Wordley had been blown by the explosion under a gun-cotton truck, which had caught fire, and was quite unable to do anything to free himself. Dobinson, without knowing the nature of the burning explosive, returned to the shed, ran in at the imminent risk of being killed by a further explosion, and released Wordley from his perilous position.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Devon) Order, 1912.

Dated 22nd January, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Devon, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Devon) Order, 1912."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Devon, so far as the undermentioned birds are concerned, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year:—

Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Gannet or Solan Goose, Grebe, Hobby, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker or Night Hawk), Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Plover (Lapwing or Poo-wit), Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Summer Snipe or Otterling, Stone Curlew or Thick Knee, Tern or Sea Swallow, Whimbrel.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Wild Swan, Bearded Titmouse.

The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Devon is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act,

1880, so far as the undermentioned Birds are concerned:—

Shag, Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Devon:—

Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Goldfinch, Guillemot or Willock, Gulls, Hawfinch, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Osprey, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Lesser Redpole, Reeve or Ruff, Wild Swan, Bearded Titmouse, Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Devon:—

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Bittern, Little Bittern, Chough, Common Crossbill, Dipper, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Rock Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Gannet, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Great Black-backed Gull, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nut-hatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Osprey, Oyster Catcher, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Razorbill, Redstart, Green Sandpiper, Common Snipe, Wild Swan, White Wagtail, Black-headed Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Fire-crested Wren.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas:—

- (i.) Lundy Island and the neighbouring islets.
- (ii.) Baggy Point district, situate in the parish of Georgeham, and bounded by the sea from the coast off Croyde Bay House to that off Vention Cottages, and thence by the roads passing near Croyde Village, by way of Vention-lane, Stentaway-lane and Moor-lane, to the coast off Croyde Bay House.
- (iii.) Clovelly district, being the parishes of Abbotsham, Alwington, Clovelly, Hartland, Parkham, Welcombe, and Woolfardisworthy (West).
- (iv.) Lynton district, being the parishes of Lynton and Countisbury.
- (v.) Slapton Ley and Start district, being the parishes of Stokenham, Slapton and Blackawton.

Duration of Order.

VIII. This Order shall remain in force until the end of the year 1912.

IX. The Order of the 18th November, 1911, is hereby repealed.

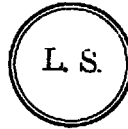
