goods coming from Java, Venezuela, Calcutta and Siam on account of cholera:—

MESURES SANITAIRES.

Le Ministre de l'intérieur,

Vu l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre, 1907, prescrivant des mesures sanitaires relativement à l'importation et au transit des marchandises provenant de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales déclarés contaminés de peste ou de choléra;

Vu les cas de peste qui se sont produits dans l'île de Java (Indes orientales néerlandaises) et au Vénézuela;

Vu les cas de choléra qui se sont produits à Calcutta (Indes anglaises) et au Siam ;

Arrête:

Art. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1 à 6 de l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre, 1907, susvisé, sont rendues applicables aux provenances de l'île de Java, du Vénézuela, de Calcutta (Indes anglaises) et du Siam.

Art. 2. Les provenances arrivant par mer seront soumises, à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende, de Nieuport, de Zeebrugge, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par le titre I, chapitre II, section III, de la convention adoptée le 3 décembre 1903 par la Conférence sanitaire internationale de Paris.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES

(DATED 27TH JANUARY 1912.)

KETTERING (ALLOTMENT GARDENS) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the parish of Kettering, in the administrative county of

Northampton to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said county and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house situate in the administrative county of Northampton, or in the county borough of Northampton, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the said county, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (5.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after

- each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust. litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
 - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
 - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any pre mises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Northampton, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (3.) The declaration shall not be offective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.

7. A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District of the Local Authority of the county of Northampton shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8. A licence under this Order authorising movement of swine to any premises shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 11. In this Order-
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:
- "Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of February, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the Ketter-ING (ALLOTMENT GARDENS) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1912.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-MENT ACT, 1907.

AMPTHILL RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

BY Order dated the 20th January, 1912, the Local Government Board declared, specified and directed as follows—that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the 2nd day of March, 1912—

- (a) Sections 20, 22, 23, 29 and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 44, 45 and 46, comprised in Part III; and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66 and 67, comprised in Part IV of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the several contributory places within the District; and (b) sections 15, 16 and 17, comprised in Part II of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the contributory places of Apsley Guise, Apsley Heath, Flitwick and Maulden, within the District.
- (2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is one of the sections by sub-division (1) of this Article, described as comprised in Part III or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the section, in any contributory place in which it is by sub-division (1) of this Article declared to be in force, shall be in force subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say: — Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct the said section, in its application to the contributory place and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the section.
