## BOROUGH OF DARWEN.

Order of the Local Government Board declaring certain sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force.

OTICE is hereby given, that by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 15th January, 1912, the following sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, are with the conditions and adaptations hereafter referred to declared to be in force within the Urban Sanitary District of Darwen from the 26th day of February, 1912:—Sections 17, 21, 22, 24, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31 and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 36, 37, 44, 50 and 51, comprised in Part III; and sections 52, 54, 55, 57, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66 and 68, comprised in Part IV. Provided that with regard to the sections of the above Act which are specified in the first column of the schedule hereto, the same shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of such schedule were added to and formed part of such sections.
