WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Chester) Order, 1912.

Dated 29th January, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Chester) Order, 1909.'

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, con- taking of Wild Birds or any of them is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, throughout the Administrative County of Chester, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the Administrative County of Chester to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Heron, Kestrel.

Other Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the area named in Clause V of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Spotted Flycatcher, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Red-backed Shrike, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren.

All Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply; the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned area:—

The portion of the Hundred of Wirral embracing the low-lying lands and sandhills situate between the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey, of which the boundaries shall commence to the south at a point of the main highway of the county of Chester 200 yards to the west of the Dock Cottages near "Docks" Railway Station of the Wirral Railway, run along the main highway to Bidston Village, and then turn in a northerly direction and run to Bidston Railway Station of the same railway, then turn in a westerly direction and run along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Meols Station of such railway, then run along the highway near to the Meols Railway Station in a northerly direction to the Irish Sea, then on the north along the margin of high-water mark of the Irish Sea to a point at New Brighton where the Yellow Noses joins the said Irish Sea, and then run in a southerly direction to "Warren Drive" or road, and along "Warren Drive" to the most northerly house and grounds on the west side of such drive, then along the western boundary of the houses and premises situate along the western side of such drive or road to a point 100 yards or so from Grove Road, then turning in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of the houses and premises in Grove Road, Wallasey, until it reaches the Wirral Railway, then turning in a southerly direction along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Wallasey Marsh, then along the edge of the marsh in a southerly direction until it reaches the Poulton Halfpenny Bridge, then turning in a westerly direction on the edge of the said marsh until it reaches along the edge of the marsh the main highway leading from Poulton to Meols.

Provided that such parts of the area aforesaid as are market-garden lands are excepted from the operation of this Clause and of Clauses IV and XI of this Order.

The area aforesaid (except market-garden lands, which are left uncoloured) is coloured pink and outlined in red on a map sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 29th January, 1912, and deposited in the office of the County Council.

Further Protection for all Birds.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited in such portions of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as are within the district of the Administrative County of Chester.

Additional Protection for the Gull and Tern.

VII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull and Tern is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester.

Certain Districts Exempted from the Operation of Clause VII.

VIII. I hereby exempt from the operation of Clause VII of this Order so much of the Administrative County of Chester as does not lie within the parishes of Puddington, Burton, Ness, Neston-cum-Parkgate, Gayton, Heswall-cum-Oldfield, Thurstaston, Caldy, Hoylake-cum-West Kirby, Wallasey, Lower Bebington, Bromborough, Eastham, Hooton, Netherpool, Whitby, Stanlow, Ince, Great Stanney, Frodsham Lordship, Weston, Runcorn, Halton, Norton, Moore, Acton Grange, Walton Inferior, including therein so much of the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as lie within the Administrative County of Chester.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IX. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester:—

Bittern, Shoveller Duck, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Heron, Kingfisher, Brown Linnet, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Lesser Redpole, Siskin, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

X. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester:—

Bittern, Dunlin, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Black-headed Gull, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Redshank, Sandpiper, Sheldrake, Shrike, Common Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, and (after May 1st in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Player)

All Eggs Protected within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

XI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the area named in Clause V for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

XII. The Order of the 13th March, 1909, is hereby repealed.

SWINE-FEVER (SPECIAL AREAS) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Facilities for Movement of Swine in Special Areas.

1.—(1.) Swine required under Article 3 (4.) (iii) of the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911 to be detained at a place of destination specified in the licence for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved from that place, if accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained—

(a) to a market, fairground or saleyard in the same Scheduled Area if the Inspector is satisfied that the swine are intended for sale

for immediate slaughter; or

(b) to any premises (other than a market, fairground or saleyard) in the same Scheduled Area, in which case Article 3 as hereby amended shall apply to swine so moved as if such premises were the original place of destination but not so as to extend the prescribed period of detention.

(2.) Swine while detained under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be kept

separate from all other swine.

Modification of Provision for Isolation in Certain Cases.

. 2.—(1.) Swine which under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever are required to be kept separate from other swine during their prescribed detention may be allowed to come in contact in the place of detention with other swine, but in that case all of the swine shall become liable to detention and isolation as if they had been moved under the same licence.

(2.) This Article applies only where the place of detention is in a Scheduled Area to which the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order

of 1911 applies.

Short Title and Construction.

3. This Order may be cited as the SWINE-FEVER (SPECIAL AREAS) ORDER OF 1912, and shall be read with the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911.

Amendment of Article 6 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1911.

1. Article 6 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1911 is hereby revoked, and the following Article substituted therefor:—

'Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles, Crates, &c., used for conveyance of Swine.

- 6.—(1.) Swine exposed for sale in any market-place, fair-ground or sale-yard, or on any highway or other premises where swine are habitually exposed for sale, shall not be placed in any van, cart or other vehicle for removal from such premises or from the place in which such premises are situate, unless and until the vehicle has been cleansed and disinfected, since it was last used for the conveyance of swine, by or on behalf of the owner of the vehicle in the manner hereby prescribed.
- (2.) This Article shall not apply if all the swine placed in the vehicle for removal were brought in that vehicle.

(3.) An Inspector of a Local Authority may by Licence exempt from the foregoing provisions of this Article any vehicle which is shown to his satisfaction to be required for use for the removal of swine intended for immediate slaughter and no other swine, and a vehicle so exempted shall be cleansed and disinfected by or on behalf of the owner of the vehicle, in the prescribed manner and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, on each day of its use for such removal of swine and after completion of such use. Any licence so granted may at any time be revoked by an Inspector of the Local

of the vehicle.

(4.) A Local Authority may, at the request of the person in charge of a vehicle required to be cleansed and disinfected, and on payment of such amount as may be agreed, carry out the prescribed cleansing and disinfection on behalf of the owner of the vehicle.

Authority by notice in writing to the owner

(5.) The Local Authority of each District shall provide for the attendance of an Inspector or other person appointed for this purpose at each sale in their District for the purpose of securing this Article being carried

into effect.

(6.) Any van, cart, or other vehicle used in connection with the conveyance of swine along any highway or thoroughfare shall forthwith be cleansed and disinfected, by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose, upon the receipt of a notice in writing served by an Inspector of

the Board or of a Local Authority requiring

such cleansing and disinfection.

(7.) The cleansing and disinfection required by this Article or by a notice served thereunder shall extend to the floor of the vehicle and all other parts with which any pig or its droppings have come in contact, and also to any crate, box, hamper, net, rope or other thing in the vehicle used, or intended to be used, for or about swine therein, and shall be carried out in the manner prescribed by Article 13 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908, except that where it is carried out by or under the supervision of an Inspector or other person appointed by the Local Authority for that purpose the use of limewash may be dispensed with by the Inspector or person so appointed.

• (8.) This Article shall not relieve any person from his liability under Articles 11 and 12 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908 which relate to cleansing and disinfection of vehicles and other things used in connection with the trade or business of a pig-dealer."

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of February, nineteen hundred and twelve.
