THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BOROUGH OF SHREWSBURY.

BY an Order of the Local Government Board, made on the 19th day of January, 1912, it was declared that certain parts and sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, that is to say:—

Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 32, and 33 comprised in Part II, Part III, Part IV, Part V, Part VI and Part X (subject nevertheless as to Part II, sections 24, 25 and 27 respectively of the 1907 Act to the conditions and adaptations contained in the Order, and those set out and contained in the First and Second Schedules to the said Order) shall be in force in the district of the borough of Shrewsbury as from the 8th day of March, 1912.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF PORTSLADE-BY-SEA.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 29th January, 1912, sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33 comprised in Part II, and the whole of Parts III, IV and VI of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, are declared to be in force in the Urban District of Portslade-by-Sea as from the 11th day of March, 1912, subject nevertheless as to certain sections to the adaptations and conditions which are contained in the second column of the Schedule to the said Order, and the effect of which is as follows:—

PART II.

Section Twenty-seven. "Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected for use by the Territorial Force."

Section Thirty. "Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or structure used for the support of any street or public footpath for protection from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or structure was built by some person other than by the highway authority after the street or footpath became a highway repairable by the inhabitants."

PART III.

Section Thirty-five. "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875.

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances to have no effect within the district in relation to any subject matter of this section."

Section Thirty-eight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect the right of owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

PART IV.

Section Fifty-nine. "Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

PART VI.

Section Seventy-six. "Nothing in this section in relation to powers of the local authority shall prejudicially affect any prohibition or restriction which applies or would otherwise apply, except so far as subsection (4) of this section otherwise allows, by virtue of any conveyance, grant, agreement or other instrument with respect to a public park or pleasure ground."
