

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate in the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Paul, Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Saint David's (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Llanelly, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Llanelly.'

"And with the like consent of the said John, Bishop of Saint David's (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The district chapelry of Christ Church, Llanelly, being:—All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Paul, Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Dafen, in the said county and diocese, upon the south-east and upon the south-west by the sea, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the southern end of the pier on the western side of the river called Afon Lliedi, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the said river is joined by the channel which connects such river with Copperworks Dock, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said channel and of Copperworks Dock for a distance in all of twenty-nine chains

and a half or thereabouts to the wall at the north-eastern end of the said dock, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the premises of the Llanelly Copper Works) for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Copperworks Road opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the Llanelly Copper Works, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Copperworks Road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Dock Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of New Dock Road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Great Western Railway across such road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and thirteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the embankment near the eastern side of the Dafen River, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul, Llanelly, from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Dafen."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.
