The following Address was presented to The King, on Saturday, the 9th instant, on the occasion of the laying of the foundation-stone of the new London County Hall:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty The King.

THE LOYAL AND DUTIFUL ADDRESS OF THE
COUNCIL OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF
LONDON.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Deputy-Chairman and members of the London County Council, beg leave to express to Your Majesty our deep sense of the honour conferred upon London by Your Majesty's gracious willingness to fulfil the wish, expressed more than once by His late Majesty King Edward VII., to lay the foundation-stone of the new County Hall. Your Majesty has recently come from India after there constituting the ancient city of Delhi to be the Capital City of India, and we are ambitious enough to hope that Your Majesty desired to emphasise the fact that the first open public act to be performed by Your Majesty should be connected with London, the historical capital of the Empire.

Your Majesty's presence on this occasion assures us of Your Majesty's continued interest in the great work which falls to us to perform in

the administration of the central services of so important a community as that of London, and we beg leave to state that it is a great encouragement to us thus to receive this signal mark of Your Majesty's favour.

The site of the new County Hall is historic in several interesting directions, and the new building which is to be erected thereon, in being devoted to the ever-growing interests of the ratepayers and inhabitants of London, will become the home of great efforts, and, it is hoped, great accomplishments for the common good of London.

We beg leave to be permitted to ask Her Majesty the Queen to receive our grateful thanks for consenting to accompany Your Majesty on this occasion, and we lay at Your Majesty's feet the heartfelt expression of gratitude with which all London views the present memorable ceremony.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

On behalf of the Queen and Myself, I thank you for this loyal and dutiful Address.

It is a great satisfaction to Me to fulfil your wish by laying the foundation-stone of the new London County Council Hall; and the

Queen and I are especially glad that this ceremony should be the first undertaken by Us since Our return from India, and that Our Son and Daughter should be with Us on this interesting and important occasion.

Your reference to My beloved Father's wish to discharge the important duty that has fallen to Me to-day recalls his unflinching interest in the work of local government, and the earnest desire which he more than once expressed that the municipal progress of London should receive the recognition to which the devoted labours of yourselves and your predecessors have entitled it.

The position of London as the Capital of the Empire, and in many aspects the centre of the world, finds expression in the noble Parliament House that faces us across the River, in the great Government Offices that have gathered beside it, in the Civic buildings of the ancient City, and in the mighty houses of commerce that line our squares and streets. But we can point to few buildings that speak of the modern County of London, and to none that sufficiently exemplify its corporate unity and proclaim its pre-eminence in the sphere of local government.

When this County Hall has arisen on the banks of the river that has shaped London's destinies, you will at last have provided a fitting centre and home for the far-reaching and varied energies demanded by the administration of London, and so have removed a reproach which falls upon no other Capital City.

The Council has in the past executed its trust with diligence and devotion, but when your deliberations are carried on in surroundings worthy of their importance, and your varied functions are organized under one central roof, there cannot fail to result a growth of efficiency, a more harmonious co-operation, and an increasing unity of purpose. But, above all, I hope that the burdens placed upon your shoulders will be lightened by the awakening in Londoners of a deeper pride and a livelier interest in the successful solution of the problems that confront their municipal representatives.

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made as regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the said Union:

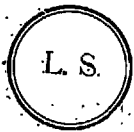
NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that the following Regulations shall be in force in the said Banbury Union as

regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the Union:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the Superintendent Nurse to visit each of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse daily, and to see that the said wards have been duly cleansed and are properly warmed and ventilated, and also that all such arrangements are made as may be necessary for the proper care of and attendance upon the inmates both by day and during the night.

ARTICLE II.—The duty of making morning and nightly visits to the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse shall cease to be part of the duties of the Master or Matron of the Workhouse, as the case may be; but, except to this extent, nothing in this Order shall affect the duties of the Master or Matron so far as those duties relate to the general control of the Workhouse

WHEREAS the population of the Parish of Ealing (hereinafter referred to as "the Parish") exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas the Overseers of the Parish, pursuant to Resolutions of the Vestry at Meetings held on Monday, the 6th day of November, 1911, and Monday, the 29th day of January, 1912, respectively, have applied to Us, the Local Government Board, for an Order putting in force in the Parish so much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the Parish.

ARTICLE II.—It shall be the duty of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed for the Parish—

To give notice of and attend the Meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend Meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers, when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the Account of all Charity Monies which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorised or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry Books and the Parish deeds and documents.

To make out, when required by the Vestry, the Church Rate, and procure the same to

be signed and completed, and to retain the custody thereof.

To keep and make out the Accounts of the Churchwardens, and to present such Accounts to the Vestry or other legal authority, to be passed, and to examine the Church Rate Collectors' Accounts and returns of arrears.

To ascertain and make out the list of persons liable to serve on juries, and to cause them to be printed and duly published, and returned to the justices.

To give the notices for claims to vote for members of Parliament, and to make out lists of voters, and get the same printed and published, and duly returned, according to law, and to attend the court for revising them, and to prepare, make out, and publish the burgess lists and the lists of constables.

To make all returns required of the Churchwardens by law or proper authority.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office; and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the Local Government Board, from time to time, at the request of the Churchwardens or Overseers of the Parish, or otherwise, shall prescribe and direct to be performed by such Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE III.—The Overseers of the Poor of the Parish shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk under the authority of this Order a salary commencing at the rate of one hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum, and rising by an increment at the end of the first year of five pounds, and by increments at the end of the second and third years of ten pounds each, to a salary at the rate of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of the Apportionment Act, 1870, and shall be paid quarterly on the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, the thirty-first day of December, and the thirty-first day of March in each year.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Local Government Board have, on the application of the council for the above named district, issued an Order in the following terms, declaring certain provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the Urban District of Cleckheaton:—

To the Urban District Council of Cleckheaton;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Cleckheaton (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority"), have in pursuance of section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain parts and sections of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the Urban District of Cleckheaton (hereinafter referred to as "the District");

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement:

NOW THEREFORE, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1.) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation,—

Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 49 and 50; comprised in Part III; Part IV; Part V; and Part VI of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the district.

(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a section comprised in Part IV, Part V, or Part VI, or is one of the sections by subdivision (1) of this Article described as comprised in Part II or Part III and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the district subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say:—

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct, the said section, in its application to the district and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the local authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule

were added to and formed part of the section.

ARTICLE II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the local authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the district, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
