ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated March 20th, 1912.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient in the interest of public convenience, that the following changes should be made in the constitution of Sub-districts of Stockport Registration District within the County Borough of Stockport, viz., the transfer of (a) Edgeley and Hollywood Wards of that County Borough from Stockport First Sub-district to Stockport Second Sub-district, and (b) Heaton Lane Ward from Stockport Second Sub-district to Stockport Third Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twelve.

And notice is hereby further given, that by an Order dated the 2nd January, 1912, the Secretary of State declares section 81 (extending definition of public place and street for certain purposes) of Part VII; Part VIII (Fire Brigade), and Part IX (Sky Signs) of the said Act to be in force in this district.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-
MENT ACT, 1907.

NESTON AND PARKGATE URBAN DISTRICT,
CHESHIRE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Secretary of State has made an Order, dated the 19th March instant, under section 3 of the above-mentioned Act, declaring section 82 of the said Act (enabling the District Council to make bye-laws as to sea shore), and section 81 adapted as shown below to be in force in the district.

Section 81 as Adapted.

Any place of public resort or recreation ground belonging to, or under the control of, the local authority, and any unfenced ground adjoining or abutting upon any street in an urban district shall be deemed to be a street for the purposes of section twenty-nine of the Town Police Clauses Act, 1847, and also for the purposes of so much of section twenty-eight of that Act as relates to the following offence:—

“Every person who throws or lays any dirt, litter, ashes, or night soil, or any carrion, fish, offal or rubbish on any street.”
