masonry, its entrance will be at a point about 350 feet from the present entrance to Widnes West Bank Dock, measured in a northwesterly direction, and will point approximately in a westerly direction. Its coping will be at or about 27 feet above Old Dock Sill.

- (b) A leading jetty of timber or reinforced concrete or a retaining wall as a continuation of the north-west pierhead of the new entrance to a point about 675 feet in a north-westerly direction from the centre line of the present entrance, with an apron of concrete or stone or slag block pitching if required, at a level not above 1 foot below Liverpool Old Dock Sill.
- (c) To continue the south-west pierhead of the new lock entrance towards the river wall of the present entrance by means of a wall or sheet piling of timber or reinforced concrete with an apron of concrete or stone or slag block pitching if required at a level not above 1 foot below Liverpool Old Dock Sill.
- (d) For the purpose of constructing the above works to form a temporary dam or dams enclosing the site of the said works, but projecting nowhere further into the river than 30 feet south-west of the coping line of the existing river wall adjoining the present entrance or of an imaginary line formed by producing this coping line.
  - (e) To dredge or otherwise remove material in the bed of the river in the approach to the new lock so far as is necessary for its proper working.
- (f) To close the present entrance subsequent to the construction of the new entrance by either a wall or sheet piling, and to maintain at this entrance the existing sluices or alternatively to substitute others of equal total area.

No part of the works which are of a permanenti nature will project further into the River Mersey than the imaginary line formed by producing the present coping line of the river wall adjoining the present entrance except in so far as the apron which will not project more than 10 feet outside this line.

The plans and sections of the works are shown on the plan lettered W 15, signed by T. R. Wilton, consulting engineer for the work, and deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy.
