"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated

church of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, situate in the parish of Preston, in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Preston, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of

Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, being: -All that part of the parish of Preston, in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the north by the parish of Patcham, in the said county and diocese, upon the east by the middle of the Brighton and Lewes Line of the London, Brighton and South Coast Railway, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Martin, Brighton, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Augustine, Preston, Brighton, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Preston, Brighton, from the said parish of Preston, at the junction of the road called Preston Drove with Osborne Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Osborne Road for a distance of twenty chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern side of the passage between the houses known as Number 149, and Number 151, Osborne Road, and extending thence north-westward to and along the north-eastern side of the said passage and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its north-western end and extending thence northward along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the space at the back of the said house and premises known as Number 151, Osborne Road, for a distance of seven yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Preston from the said parish of Patcham."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

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Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, shapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Philip, Sheffield, in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship.

"And whereas in pursuance of the power and authority given by an Order of the High Court of Chancery dated the first day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four confirming a scheme for the future application of the income of the trust property of the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield, in the said county of York, and of an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales dated the fourth day of March in the year one thousand eight bundred and seventy-four in partial variation of the scheme established by the said first mentioned Order, the said Burgesses and Commonalty have proposed to appropriate the sum of two hundred pounds per annum out of that part of the income of their trust property which is applicable to ecclesiastical purposes in and towards the endowment of the district herein proposed to be constituted.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have signified by a Writing bearing date the first day of February in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve under our common seal our approval of and consent to the proposed endowment of the said proposed district.

hundred pounds per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Twelve Capital Burgesses and : Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, which is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named The District of Saint Nathanael, Sheffield.'

> "And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield and their successors. ٠. ٠,

> "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, amending the existing Statutes of the said University, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is hereby published in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE MADE BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD, ON THE 5TH MARCH, 1912.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Statt. Tit. VI, sect. 1 E, § 2, "Concerning the Nomination of Examiners," so as to provide that in certain exceptional cases the nomination of a Master of the Schools, Moderator, or Examiner may be made by the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors instead of by a Nominating Committee, the University enacts as follows:—

I. In Statt. Tit. VI, sect. 1 E, § 2, clause 1, after the word "nominated" the words "by a Committee" shall be inserted, and after the word "prescribed" the following words shall be added: "Provided that when it is necessary to nominate, for one examination only, a Master of the Schools, Moderator, or Examiner to fill a vacancy caused by death, or resignation, or removal for misconduct, or to act as substitute when leave of absence has been granted on account of sickness or other urgent cause, the nomination may be made by the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors."

2. Ibid., clause 2, after the word "nomination" the words "not being a nomination made by the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors under the provisions of clause 1 above," shall be inserted.

THE STATUTES OF THE IMPERIAL SERVICE ORDER.

. GEORGE, R. & I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come. Greeting:

Whereas, by Warrants under His late Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, dated the eighth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two and the second year of His Reign, the twenty-ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six and the sixth year of His Reign, the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and the eighth year of His Reign, and the seventeenth day of June one thousand nine hundred and nine in the ninth year of His Reign, His late Majesty, being desirous of recognising more fully than had theretofore been possible the faithful and meritorious services rendered to Him by Members of the Civil Services of the various parts of His Empire, did, for Himself, His Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Civil Order of Distinction—to be designated the Imperial Service Order—and He was graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Rules and Ordinances for the government of the same:

And whereas We are minded to make certain amendments and additions to the Statutes of the Order:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in the exercise of the power vested in Us by the aforesaid Statutes, and in order to enable Us to carry this Our Will and Pleasure into effect, We do hereby abrogate the aforesaid Statutes of the eighth day of August one thousand nine hundred and two, the twenty-ninth day of November one thousand nine hundred and six, the twenty-seventh day of May one thousand nine hundred and eight and the seventeenth day of June one thousand nine hundred and nine and the same are abrogated accordingly, but without prejudice to anything done thereunder; and, in lieu thereof, We do by these Presents Make, Ordain, and Establish the following Statutes and Ordinances:

Firstly.—It is ordained that this Order shall henceforth be styled and designated "The Imperial Service Order."

Secondly.—It is ordained that the Order shall consist of the Sovereign, the Prince of Wales, and such Companions as We, Our Heirs or Successors, shall appoint.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that We, our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens Regnant of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperors and Empresses of India, are and for ever shall be Sovereigns of this Order.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that only the Members of the administrative or clerical branches of Our Civil Services shall be eligible for the distinction of Companions of this Order.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that the number of Companions of the Order shall not exceed seven hundred, of whom two hundred and fifty shall belong to Our Home Civil Service, two hundred to Our Civil Services in India, including the Staff of Our Secretary of State for India (one hundred appointments being reserved for Europeans and one hundred for natives of India), and two hundred and fifty to the Civil Services of Our Dominions beyond the Seas, and Countries under Our Protection, including the Staff of the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that no person shall be eligible to be a Companion of the Order whose name has not been laid before Us, Our Heirs or Successors, by one of Our or Their Principal Secretaries of State, and who has not at the time of his or her nomination rendered at least twenty-five years' meritorious service in Our said Civil Services: Provided that in the Indian Empire the minimum period of service in the case of Europeans shall be twenty years, and that in any part of Our Dominions beyond the Seas, or any Country under Our Protection, which, under the Pension Acts or Regulations applying thereto, is recognised as unhealthy, the minimum of service shall be sixteen years: Provided also that it shall be competent to Us, Our Heirs or Successors, to appoint specially to the Order persons who, not having completed the aforesaid periods of service, have rendered such eminently meritorious service as to qualify them, in Our opinion, to become recipients of this distinction.

Seventhly.—It is ordained that when We, Our Heirs, and Successors, shall be pleased to appoint any person to be a Companion of the Order, such appointment shall be made by Warrant under Our Sign Manual and countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

Eighthly.—It is ordained that the decoration to be worn by Companions of the Order shall be: for men, a Badge or Medallion of gold or enamel, bearing Our Imperial and Royal Cypher, and the words "For Faithful Service," both to be executed in dark blue enamel on a plaque or shield of gold, surrounded by a seven-pointed star of silver, surmounted by the Imperial Crown; and for women, a Badge or Medallion in all respects similar to the Badge or Medallion for men, save that the plaque or shield of gold shall be surrounded by a wreath of laurel in silver instead of a star, surmounted by the Imperial Crown.

Ninthly.—It is ordained that the decoration shall be worn by male Companions on the left breast, suspended by a ribbon of one inch and a half in width, consisting of a strip of blue between two strips of crimson of equal size, and by female Companions on the left shoulder, suspended by a ribbon of the same colour and width, fashioned into a bow.

Tenthly.—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We are pleased to confer the decoration shall be published in the London Gazette.

Eleventhly.—It is ordained that Companions of the Order shall have the privilege of adding the Letters "I.S.O:" after their names.

Twelfthly.—It is ordained that members of any Order of Knighthood shall, if otherwise qualified, be eligible to become Companions of this Order, and that male Companions of this Order shall in no way be debarred from becoming thereafter Members of any Order of Knighthood for which their services may qualify them.

Thirteenthly—It is ordained that the Imperial Service Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, Our Distinguished Service Order, and before the Fifth Class of Our Royal Victorian Order, and the Companions thereof shall, in all places and assemblies whatsoever, have place and precedency next to, and immediately after, the Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, and shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations.

Fourteenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, to cancel and annul the appointment of any Companion of this Order, and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when circumstances render it just and expedient so to do.

Fifteenthly.—It is ordained that those Members of Our Civil Services, who are not eligible for appointment as Companions of this Order may, on retirement from Our said Services, after not less than twenty-five years of meritorious service; or, in the case of Europeans serving in the Indian Empire; after not less than twenty years of such service, or in the case of service in any part of Our Dominions beyond the Seas, or any Country under Our Protection which, under the Pension Acts or Regulations applying thereto, is recognised as unhealthy, after not less than sixteen years of such service, be awarded a Medal to be designated "The Imperial Service Medal": Provided that no such Medal shall be granted, except on the

recommendation of one of Our Principal Secretifical, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His taries of State: Provided also that it shall be Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both competent to Us, Our Heirs or Successors, to confer the Medal upon not more than five Members of Our Civil Services in each year who have retired after less than twenty-five years' service, should the special circumstances in Our or Their opinion justify the grant.

Sixteenthly.—It is ordained that the Imperial Service Medal for men and women shall in all respects be similar to the badge of the Imperial Service Order for men and women respectively, save that the plaque shall be of silver, instead of gold, and the star or wreath of laurel shall be of bronze instead of silver, and it is ordained that the Imperial Service Medal shall be worn in a similar manner to that prescribed for the Imperial Service Order, and that these Medals shall bear on the reverse the

name of the recipient.

Seventeenthly.—It is ordained that the names of those persons to whom the Imperial Service Medal shall be granted shall be duly published in the London Gazette.

Eighteenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, to cancel and annul the award of any Imperial Service Medal, and that thereupon the name of the recipient in the Register shall be erased; but it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore the Medal to any person whose name may have been so erased, when circumstances render it just and expedient so to do. And every person to whom the said Medal is awarded shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the Medal if his name shall be erased as aforesaid.

Nineteenthly.—It is ordained that an Officer shall be appointed to the Order who shall be styled "Secretary and Registrar," and who shall be ex-officio a Companion of the Order.

Twentiethly.—It is ordained that the Secretary and Registrar of this Order shall be appointed by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, and shall have the custody of the Archives of the Order, which shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for the Home Department. He shall attend the service of the Order and shall execute such directions as he may, receive from Our Principal Secretaries of State.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order.
