

“And whereas the said endowment of two hundred pounds per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, which is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Nathanael, Sheffield.’

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield and their successors.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

“The district of Saint Nathanael, Sheffield, being—All that part of the new parish (some-time chapelry district) of Saint Philip, Sheffield, in the county of York and in the diocese of York, which is bounded upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Mary, Walkley, upon the west partly by the last-named new parish and partly by the district of Saint Timothy, Crookes, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Thomas, Crookes, upon the south-east partly by the last-named new parish, partly by the new parish of Saint George, Sheffield, and partly by the new parish of Saint Stephen, Netherthorpe, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Netherthorpe, from the said new

parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, crosses the middle of Fawcett Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Fawcett Street for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Wentworth Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Wentworth Street for a distance of six yards or thereabouts to its junction with Bond Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Bond Street for a distance of eight chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Crookesmoor Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Crookesmoor Road for a distance of three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Ashberry Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Ashberry Road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Uppertorpe, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Uppertorpe for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footway leading past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Number 128, Uppertorpe, into the road called Birkendale, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said footway for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its north-western end on the southern side of Birkendale, and extending thence first north-westward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Birkendale for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Birkendale View, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Birkendale View for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the house known as Number 22, Birkendale View, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to the said house for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses situate on the southern side of Fulton Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the house known as Number 27, Fulton Road, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its north-western end on the southern side of Fulton Road, and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the middle of Fulton Road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, from the said new parish of Saint Mary, Walkley.”

“And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the new parish of Saint Philip, Sheffield, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:”
