of our common fund it is expedient that the said tithe rent charges, lands, allotments and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such tithe rent charges, lands, allotments, and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

" Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said tithe rent charges, lands, allotments and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithe rent charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act

of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Salisbury.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her

said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, of the new parish of Coldhurst, and of the new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventh day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-second day of the same month, five separate districts for spiritual purposes were constituted out of the ancient parochial chapelry of Oldham, in the parish of Prestwich, in the said county of Lancaster and at that time in the diocese of Chester, but now in the said diocese of Manchester, and two of such districts were named 'The District of Saint Matthew, Chadderton,' and 'The District of Coldhurst.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the eleventh day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, situate in the new parish of Royton, in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester, and such district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton.'

"And whereas the said district of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, the said district of Coldhurst, and the said district chapelry of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton; have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to the said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four."

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, of the said new parish of Coldhurst, and of the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter

mentioned.

"NOW THEREFORE, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this
