scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, of the said new parish of Coldhurst, and of the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, and of the said new parish of Coldhurst, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green and pink respectively, shall be dissevered from such new parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbeforementioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, being:—

"1. All that portion of the new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon part of the north by the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, upon the east partly by the new parish of Coldhurst and partly by the consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Oldham, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-west, upon the north-west, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Oldham, from the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, at or near the junction of Chadderton Road, Garforth Street and Burnley Lane, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Burnley Lane for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction at the Rifle Range Inn with the footpath leading to Wood Farm, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading along the eastern side of the stream which flows past the northern side of Fernhurst Mill into the stream known as Plumpton Clough, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Plumpton Clough, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of Plumpton Clough for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, from the said new parish of Saint

Anne, Longsight, Royton.

"2. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Coldhurst which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton, upon the west by the above described portion

of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, upon the south-west by the consoli-dated chapelry of All Saints, Oldham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Oldham, from the said new parish of Coldhurst, at the junction of Sherwood Street with Featherstall Road North, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Featherstall Road North for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Westhulme Street, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of Westhulme Street and along the middle of the roadway in continuation thereof for a distance in all of fifteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall forming the southern boundary of the Oldham Union Workhouse, and extending thence first eastward to the said boundary wall and then first eastward, then northward, and then again eastward along such boundary wall for a distance in all of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Rochdale Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of Rochdale Road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Booth Hill Lane, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Booth Hill Lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Coldhurst from the said new parish of Saint Anne, Longsight, Royton."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patrons and Incumbents have respec-

tively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the
