

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing scheme or representation has reference.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield, and to be annexed to the new parish of King Cross, in the said county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, which is bounded upon the south-west by the said new parish of King Cross, upon the north by the new parish of Saint Mary, Halifax, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary, Halifax, from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, at the junction of Hopwood Lane with Francis Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Francis Street for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, from the said new parish of King Cross.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of King Cross and to be annexed to the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, being:—

"1. All that portion of the said new parish of King Cross which is bounded upon the north-east by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, from the said new parish of King Cross, at the junction of King Cross Street with Parkinson Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Parkinson Lane for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Francis Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Francis Street for a distance of seven chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of King Cross from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax.

"2. And also all that other portion of the said new parish of King Cross which is bounded upon the north-east, upon the east, and upon the south-east by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax, from the said new parish of King Cross, at the junction of Savile Park Road with Arden Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Arden Road for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Swires Road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of King Cross from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Halifax.

"The THIRD SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of King Cross and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Jude, Salterhebble, in the said county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of King Cross which is bounded upon

the south by the new parish of Salterhebble, in the said county and diocese, upon the east partly by the last-named new parish and partly by the said new parish of Saint Jude, Salterhebble, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Jude, Salterhebble, from the said new parish of King Cross, at the junction of Savile Park Road with Emscote Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Emscote Street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Moorfield Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Moorfield Street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running along the northern side of Savile Park, and extending thence southward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the north-western corner of Savile Park) for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the eastern corner of the grounds attached to the Crossley Orphanage, and extending thence south-westward along the wall forming the south-eastern boundary of the grounds attached to the said Orphanage for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to its south-western end on the north-eastern side of Skircoat Moor Road, and extending thence first south-westward to the junction of Skircoat Moor Road with the road called Albert Promenade, and then south-westward along the middle of Albert Promenade for a distance in all of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the house called Wood View and through Scar Wood to Scar Bottom Road, and extending thence first south-westward and then generally southward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Scar Bottom Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Scar Bottom Road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wood House Lane upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of King Cross from the said new parish of Salterhebble.

"The FOURTH SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of King Cross and to be annexed to the new parish of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, in the said county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of King Cross which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the south-west by the said new parish of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, from the said new parish of King Cross, at a point in the middle of the River Calder, at a distance of three hundred and eighty yards, measured along the middle of the said river from the centre of Sladen Bridge, which carries Fall Lane across such river, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the canal known as the Calder and Hebble Navigation and also Wakefield Road) for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to a point on the northern side of Wakefield Road at the middle of the bottom end of Washer Lane Steps, and extend-
