The trime appointed for the General Aflembly of their States of Poland begins now to approach, not without great apprehensions to the Protestalits , that somewhat may be put in execution to infringe the liberty of Religion given them by the Agreement formerly made at Sandomir 7 39 which te Kings of Poland are obliged to promile free liberty of Con science, especially to the Protestants. This Agreement the Catholicks are now labouting to avoid, and have made some Proposals, that the States shall require the New King to abolish it. Prince Redzeville having timely notice thereof, has written to leveral of the Protestant Nobility, to take care to prevent it, and to appoint some of their Deputies to attend the States General.

Naffokin the Envoy! from the Great Duke of Muscouy, is with much industry and are folliciting the Nobility in the behalf of theryoung Prince; which the Grand Seignior Iabours to frustrate by his threats to enter Poland with a vast Army, and by Fire and Sword to shew his resentment, unless the Crown of Poland will engage to quit the interest of the Museu ites his Enemies, and leave Ukrania free from any farther diffu bance.

His Highness the Elector of Brandenburg having writren a Letter to the States General, to acquaint them of his late Marriage; the States have ordered another to be fent him in rourn with their Complements of congratulations

They have taken into their confideration the extraordinary expences of the Heer Hanterive, the Governour of Breda, during the late Treaty in that place, and have orwhered him a Present of 6000 Gilders towards his Compensarion. They have also made another Present to the Prince of Tarante, in recompense of what he disbursed in clearing the Countrey about Boisleduke from the Bithop of Munfters forces.

The Sieur Beruftadt, Envoye from the Cantons of Swisserland, has offered the Ciates 3000 men of their Nation to be entred into their service, but as yet nothing

is resolved as to their entertainment.

Monfieur Van Pallant, Director of the Order of the Knights of Mattha, is preffing hard for an answer in fatisfaction to their demands, but the States have not yet determined what return they shall make to them.

Paris, Aug. 18. His Maiesty has ordered the Marquis de Louvey to take a view of all the frontier Gatisons of

Flanders, and thole of his new Conquets, and to give confinient Orders in all places for the Regulation of the forces-in the several Garrisons, which are faid to be much leffened.
