MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. BOROUGH OF BANBURY.

So much of Bloxham Road as extends for a distance of 350 feet from its junction with

Oxford Road;

So much of Broughton Road as extends in an easterly direction from a point 200 feet west of its junction with Bear Garden Road, West Bar Street, High Street, Bridge Street, and so much of Middleton Road as extends

from Bridge Street to a point 200 feet northeast of its junction with West Street; and Parsons Street and the Market Place.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH APRIL 1912.)

ISLAND OF YELL (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the Island of Yell, in the county of Zetland (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area").

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 20th July.

2.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in the Dipping Area shall, on the twentieth day of July in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to such person or persons as may be appointed by the Local Authority, a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the Dipping Area upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such

farm or holding or other premises on the twentieth day of July, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.

- (2.) The owner of any sheep brought into the Dipping Area between the twentieth day of July and the fifteenth day of September in each year, shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.
- (3.) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, and forms shall be supplied for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.

Double Dipping of all Sheep in Dipping Area between 1st August and 15th September.

- 3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area between the first day of August and the fifteenth day of September in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period"), shall, subject to the next following Article, be dipped by the owner or person in charge of the sheep twice between those dates, with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for Sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.
- (2.) The dippings shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and served by post or otherwise on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.
- (3.) All sheep after having been dipped twice shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept, as far as practicable, isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped.
- (4.) The dipping required by this Order is instead of the dipping required under Article 3 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907.

Powers of Entry and Examination.

4. For the purposes of the preceding Article an Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to the direction of the Local Authority, enter any premises within the Dipping Area and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area between 1st August and 15th September.

- 5.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved out of the Dipping Area between the first day of August and the fifteenth day of September in each year unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.
 - (2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied
 - (a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse;

a licence for movement under this Article shall be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have been dipped twice, in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this Order, and have since the dippings been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

(3.) A licence under this Order does not affect the requirements of Article 15 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of Eng-

land) Order of 1907.

Disinfection.

6. The occupier of any premises in the Dipping Area shall, if so required by a notice served on him by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, disinfect at his own expense, and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Autho rity, any building, pen, or like enclosure on the premises which has been used for sheep.

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Sheep, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall be kept as far as practicable separate from all other sheep in the Dipping Area.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel in which the sheep is conveyed, and the consignee or other person re-ceiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to send or deliver any return required by this Order, or falsely makes any return for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the

Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person required by notice under this Order to carry out any disinfection fail to carry it out, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:

- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the ISLAND OF YELL (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1912.

CLAYTON URBAN DISTRICT.

To the Urban District Council of Clayton:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Clayton (hereinafter referred to as "the local authority") have, in pursuance of section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain parts and sections of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the Urban District of Clayton (hereinafter referred to as "the district");

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement:

NOW THEREFORE, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation,—

Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33, comprised in Part II; Part III; Part IV; Part V; Part VI; and section 95, comprised in Part X, of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the district.

(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a section comprised in Part III, Part IV or Part V, or is one of the sections by subdivision (1) of this Article described as comprised in Part II, and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the district subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say,-

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in sections 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct, the said section, in its application to the district, and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the local authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

ARTICLE II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the local authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the district, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

SCHEDULE.

Parts and Sections.

Conditions and Adaptations.

1. PART II. Section twenty-five. 2.

"The power of making

enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the

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paving of yards and open spaces in connexion with dwelling - houses, shall cease to be exerciseable."

Section twentyseven.

(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

Section thirty.

"Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or other structure in so far as the same is used either for the support of any street or public footpath, or for the protection of any street or public footpath from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above

or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after the street or footpath became a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large by or at the expense of a person other than the highway authority responsible for the repair of the street or footpath.''

PART III. Section thirty- " five.

This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875."

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not, in relation to any subject-matter of this section, be of any force or effect within the district."

Section thirtyeight.
