and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Marldon which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the parish of Marldon.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Lord Iddesleigh and of the said John George Edmund Templer (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Marldon, now vested in them the said Lord Iddesleigh and the said John George Edmund Templer as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commis-sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years

of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Eccles, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of the same month, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the conse-orated church of Saint Andrew, situate in Monton Lane, in the parish of Eccles, in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester, and the said consoli-dated chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eccles.

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eccles, has under the pro-visions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Eccles, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned,

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Eccles, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said parish of Eccles, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, · Eccles:
