on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, Lord Bishop of Southwark, hath made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall. Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edward, by Divine permission Bishop of Southwark, do in pursuance of the twentysixth section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, hereby represent to your Grace

"J. There is in the county of Surrey and my diocese of Southwark the vicarage of Mortlake, the parish whereof lies adjoining to the ecclesiastical parish of Kew and the consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of eight thousand one hundred and seventy-seven, but now contains a population of seventeen thousand.

"2. The net annual value of the benefice of Mortlake arising from tithe rentcharge, dividends from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, surplice fees, pew rents, and Easter offerings is four hundred and twenty-five pounds.

"3. In the same county and diocese is the vicarage of Kew, the ecclesiastical parish whereof contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of two thousand six hundred and ninety-nine.

"4. The net annual value of the benefice of Kew arising from tithe rentcharge and other sources is four hundred and eighty pounds.

"5. In the same county and diocese is the consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond, which contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of three thousand six hundred and eighty-five.

"6. The net annual value of the benefice of St. Luke, Richmond, arising from pew rents, dividends from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, Easter offerings, surplice fees, and other sources is three hundred pounds.

"7. It appears to me (1) that a certain district of the ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake, being contiguous to the ecclesiastical parish of Kew, may under the provisions of the said Act of the first and second Victoria, cap. 106, and of the Act of the second and third years of the same reign, cap. 49, be advantageously separated from the said ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake and united to the said ecclesiastical parish of Kew, and also (2) that a certain other district of the said parish of Mortlake, being contiguous to the said consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond, may, under the provisions of the said Acts, also be advantageously separated from the said ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake and united to the said consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond.

"8. The Very Reverend William Moore Ede, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral Church of Christ and of the Blessed Mary the Virgin of Worcester, and the Chapter of the same church are the patrons of the said benefice of Mortlake, His Most Gracious Majesty The King is the patron of the said benefice of Kew, and I, the Bishop aforesaid, am the patron of the said benefice of St. Luke, Richmond.

"9. The Reverend Horace Granville Monroe is the present Incumbent of the said benefice of Mortlake, the Reverend William Henry Bliss is the present Incumbent of the said benefice of Kew, and the Reverend Paul Martin Chamney is the present Incumbent of the said benefice of St. Luke, Richmond.

"10. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Bishop. have drawn up a scheme in writing, appended to this representation, describing the two areas or districts of the ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said ecclesiastical parish of Kew and the said consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond respectively, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and of the said Reverend Horace Granville Monroe and the said Reverend William Henry Bliss, and in case you shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied therewith, I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the patrons thereto to His Majesty in Council." .. .

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop is as follows :---

"SCHEME.

· .:. .

"1. It is proposed to separate a district from the ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake, in the county of Surrey and diocese of Southwark, and unite such district for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining ecclesiastical parish of Kew, in the same county and diocese.

"It is further proposed that such district shall consist of all that northern portion of the said parish of Mortlake which is bounded on the north-west in part by the said parish of Kew and in part by the parish of St. Luke, Richmond, in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the north-east in part by the said parish of Kew and in part by the River Thames, on the south or south-west by High Park Road, and on the south-east by West Hall Road, by the lane continuing therefrom to the dock belonging to the main drainage works and by the said dock, and such district is coloured pink, and indicated by the letter A on the annexed plan.

"2. It is also proposed to separate a certain other district from the said ecclesiastical parish of Mortlake and unite such district to the consolidated chapelry of St. Luke, Richmond aforesaid.

"It is further proposed that such district shall consist of all that portion of the said parish of Mortlake which is bounded on the west in part by the said parish of St. Luke, Richmond, and in part by the parish of
