ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 9th May, 1912.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the

sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in order that Stratford-on-Avon Registration District may consist of two Sub-districts respectively co-extensive with the recently-altered Relief Districts of the Poor Law Union of the same name, that the following changes should be made in the constitution of Sub-districts of that Registration District:—

(1) That Wootton Wawen Sub-district should be abolished, that all its constituent civil parishes except Snitterfield should be added to Stratford-on-Avon Sub-district, and that Snitterfield civil parish should be added to Wellesbourne Sub-district.

(2) That Alderminster and Whitchurch civil parishes should be transferred from Stratford-on-Avon Sub-district to Wellesbourne Sub-district; and

(3) That Alveston civil parish should be transferred from Wellesbourne Sub-district to Stratford-on-Avon Sub-district.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 9th May, 1912.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Aldeby Sub-district of Loddon Registration District should be united with Loddon Sub-district of the same Registration District, and that the enlarged Sub-district should be called and known as Loddon Sub-district.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve.
