"Whereas, by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas it has been decided that Midshipmen shall be rated Acting Sub-Lieutenant on passing in seamanship and navigation after 2 years and 4 months' service afloat in the former rank:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Midshipmen thus rated Acting Sub-Lieutenant should receive an advance of pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to pay to Midshipmen rated Acting Sub-Lieutenant under this arrangement full pay at the rate of 3s. 6d. a day.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the extension of the allowance accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."
