middle of Cowpasture Road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the stream called Cow Close Gill Beck and extending thence first south-eastward and then southwestward along the middle of Cow Close Gill Beck for a distance of seventy-four chains or thereabouts to the point at Gill Head where the roadway leading across Ilkley Moor from Ilkley to Bingley crosses the head waters of such beck, and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to the point near the boundary stone called Lanshaw Lad where such roadway crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Ilkley from the said new parish of Saint John the Divine, Menstone with Woodhead.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion. of the said new parish of Burley which is bounded upon the north-west by the said parish of Ilkley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the southeast, upon the east, and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Ilkley from the said new parish of Burley crosses the middle of the moor road leading from Ilkley to Burley, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said moor road for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Stead Farm House, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle, of the said roadway for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the said farmhouse, and extending thence first eastward to and along the said wall or fence, and then northward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the same premises for a distance in all of two chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading. from the said farmhouse into the footpath which leads from Stead Hall Farm House to the house called Wharfedale Grange, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath leading from Stead Farm House for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction opposite to the boundary stone placed on the north side of such footpath and inscribed St. J. B. R. 1912., No. 1, with the said footpath leading from Stead Hall Farm House, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the lane or footpath leading from Burley into the road called Ben Rhydding Drive and opposite to the boundary stone placed on the south side of such lane or footpath and inscribed St. J. B. R. 1912 No. 2, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said lane or footpath for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private road leading from the house called Wharfedale Grange towards Rowley Wood, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Rowley Wood into the road called Ben Rhydding Drive, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said road leading into Ben Rhydding Drive for a distance of two

chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Burley from the said parish of Ilkley."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

## Privy Council Office, June 24, 1912.

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 18th day of June, 1912, amending the provisions of Titulus V and Titulus XIX, § 18, of the Statutes of the said University, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is hereby published in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions of Statt. Tit. V and of Statt. Tit. XIX § 18 so as to reconstitute the Faculties and the Boards of Faculties, to constitute a General Board of the Faculties and to determine its functions and powers, to make provision for the appointment of University Lecturers and University Demonstrators, and in particular to provide

- (i) that the members of each Faculty shall be the recognized teachers in that Faculty;
- (ii) that the Delegacy of the Common University Fund shall cease to exist, and that certain of its powers shall be vested in the General Board of the Faculties;
- (iii) that a portion of the income of the Common University Fund shall be called the Faculties Fund and shall be administered by the General Board of the Faculties, and that the residue shall be applied by the University for one or more of the purposes for which the same shall be applicable under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877;

The University enacts as follows:

I. In Statt. Tit. V, the words "Titulus V: Concerning Boards of Faculties and Boards of Studies" and Sections I-VII inclusive shall be struck out, and the following Title and Sections shall be substituted: "Titulus V: Concerning the Faculties, the Boards of Faculties, and the Boards of Studies.

Sections I to XII are a Statute made by the University by way of alteration of certain Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners, and also by way of alteration cf certain Statutes made by the University.

## SECTIO I.-PRELIMINARY.

1. In and for the purposes of this Statute : The word ' Faculty ' shall mean the Teachers
