Commissioner shall, as far as he deems it Northampton as lies within the following bounpracticable, have regard as well to the number of persons rated in the ward as to the aggregate

rating of the ward.

And whereas the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, did by Warrant dated the 14th day of November, 1911, appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said appointment prepared the following Scheme, dated the 29th day of March, 1912, accordingly:

BOROUGH OF NORTHAMPTON.

I, the said Harold McKenna, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the Boundaries of the twelve Wards into which the Borough of Northampton is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:

And, unless the contrary appears, where, in the following descriptions of the Ward boundaries, a street is given as the boundary thereof, the boundary is to be taken as the centre ofsuch street and where any street is described as joining another street, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets and continued, would intersect each other.

No. 1. Castle Ward.

I do hereby determine that Castle Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the Western boundary of the borough in the River Nene opposite Norfolk Street, proceeding thence Northwards, North-Eastwards and Southwards successively along the boundary of the borough to the Northern boundary of the Kingsley Ward hereinafter defined thence in a South-Westerly direction along the Northern boundaries of the Kingsley Ward and Saint Lawrence's Ward as hereinafter defined, thence in a Southerly direction along the Western boundary of Saint Lawrence's Ward to a point at the junction of Kingsthorpe Road and Agnes Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the Northern boundary of the North Ward as hereinafter defined to the Western boundary of the borough at the point of commencement afore-

No. 4. NORTH WARD.

I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at Spencer Bridge, where it crosses the River Nene, proceeding thence in Easterly and Northerly directions successively along the boundaries of the Castle Ward and Saint Lawrence's Ward respecas hereinbefore and hereinafter respectively defined, to a point at the junction of the centres of Kingsthorpe Road and Agnes Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Agnes Road and across Semilong Road to and along the centre of Norfolk Street and continuing in a straight line in the same direction to the Western boundary of the borough, thence in a Southerly direction along the boundary of the borough and the Eastern boundary of Saint James' Ward as hereinafter defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.
