RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

The following Rule has been signed and declared urgent by the Lord Chancellor:—

THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (FORMS) RULE, 1912.

The following forms, namely, Forms 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 29, 31, 32 and 34 in Part I of the Schedule to the Summary

Jurisdiction Rules, 1886, and Forms 5 and 6 in Schedule A of the Summary Jurisdiction (Children Act) Rules, 1909, shall be amended by the omission of the words "and of his conveyance to the said prison" and the words "and of his conveyance to the said prison [or place of detention]" wherever they occur.
