3. An Area bounded on the west by the Minster and Deal Branch of the South-Eastern Railway from Minster Railway Station to Deal Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the road from Deal Railway Station to Deal Pier, and bounded on the east by the sea, and bounded on the north by the South-Eastern Railway from Minster Station to Ramsgate Station.

4. An Area lying east and south of the main road from Walmer through Dover to Folkestone from the point where such road passes through the southern boundary of the Walmer Urban District to the point where such road enters the borough of Folkestone, such area being bounded on the east and south by the sea, and on the north by the Walmer Urban District, and on the south by the borough of Folkestone.

5. An Area lying south and west of the main road which runs from Appledore Railway Station through Snargate, Brenzett, and Old Romney, to New Romney Station, and thence to Littlestone-on-Sea, such Area being bounded on the north-west by the Royal Military Canal from Appledore Railway Station to the Sussex Boundary, and bounded on the south-west by the Sussex Boundary, and on the south and east by the sea.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the administrative county of Kent as is not within the Metropolitan Police District:—Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Turtle Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Grebe (all species), Hen Harrier, Hawfinch, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Phalarope, Great Plover (Thick Knee), Kentish Plover, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpoll, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Waxwing, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck.

VIII. Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern

Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Phalarope, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Pochard, Quail, American Quail (Colin), Water Rail, Raven, Redshank, Lesser Redpoll, Redstart, Robin, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Snipe, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Longtailed Tit, Blue-headed Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 22nd May, 1907, is hereby repealed.
