MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

Whereas by subsection 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said subsection putting the above mentioned provisions of that subsection in force within the limits comprising West Hill and Swain's Lane, Highgate, within the Metropolitan Borough of St. Pancras;

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 25th day of August, 1911, and in the Hampstead and Highgate Express of the 26th day of August, 1911;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the County Hall, Spring Gardens, S.W., on Tuesday, the third day of September, 1912, at a quarter past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application;

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said application.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX AND BOROUGH OF RICHMOND.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Govern-

ment Board may, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by the Local Government Board in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding two tons in weight unladen;

And whereas Richmond Bridge is situate partly within the Urban District of Twickenham, in the County of Middlesex, and partly within the Borough of Richmond, in the County of Surrey;

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Middlesex and the Council of the Borough of Richmond have made applications to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any heavy motor car (as defined by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904) may be driven upon the highway known as Bridge Street, Richmond, and upon so much of the highway passing over Richmond Bridge as extends from its junction with Bridge Street to its junction with Willoughby Road, in the Urban District of Twickenham;

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their Office, Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the fourth day of September, 1912.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council, addressed to the Clerk to the County Council of Middlesex, 63, Victoria Street, S.W., and to the Council of the Borough, addressed to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Richmond, Surrey.
