

to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title, &c.

13. This Order may be cited as the EAST SUSSEX AND KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 3), and shall be read with the principal Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Zone in which the Modifications Contained in this Order take Effect.

A Zone comprising:—

Such portions of the parishes of Stone cum Ebony, Fairfield, Snargate, Appledore (and

of its detached part next Stone cum Ebony), Kenardington, and of the detached part of the parish of Woodchurch, as lie to the north and west of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway Line from Rye to Ashford, the parishes of Woodchurch (excluding the part of the detached portion of the parish which lies to the east of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway), Bethersden, Smarden, High Halden, and Headcorn, such portions of the parishes of Boughton Malherbe, Ulcombe, East Sutton, Sutton Valence, and Chart Sutton, as lie to the south, east, and west of the roads from Pemples Cross to Boughton Green (via Great Humphreys Farm, Broadstone, Eastwood, Pye Corner, Baker's Farm, Kingsnorth Wood, Jubilee Corner, Divers Farm, Charlton Court, St. Peter and St. Paul's Church, Sutton Valence, Wormlake, Norton Court, and Amberfield), the parishes of Boughton Monchelsea, Linton, Hunton, Nettlestead, and Yalding, such parts of the parishes of East Peckham and Hadlow as lie to south and east of the main road from West Malling to Tonbridge, that part of the parish of Marden which lies to the north of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway Line from Tonbridge to Ashford, that part of the parish of Staplehurst which lies to the north of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway Line, to the east of the main road from Maidstone to Cranbrook and to the north of the road from Staplehurst to Sinkhurst Green; and such parts of the parishes of Frittenden, Biddenden, Wittersham, and of the borough of Tenterden as lie to the north and east of the road from Staplehurst to Peasmars (via Sinkhurst Green, Frittenden, Pond Farm, Buckhurst Bridge, Clay Bridge, Ongley West and East, Worsenden Green, Biddenden, Woolpack, Duesden Wood, High Halden Road Station, St. Michaels, High Street Tenterden, Broad Tenterden, Smallhythe Bridge, Peening Quarter, Wittersham and Ham Green), in the administrative county of Kent; and the petty sessional division of Hastings (including the Borough of Beaxhill and the Liberty of the Sluice Cinque Port Liberty of Hastings and the other detached part of the petty sessional division of Hastings), the parishes of Iden, Playden, East Guldeford, St. Thomas the Apostle Winchelsea, Icklesham, Udimore (excluding its detached parts), Rye Foreign (including its detached part), Peasmars, the detached parts of the parish of Brede, the detached part of the Cinque Port Liberty of Hastings, Hollington Rural, Crowhurst, Ninfeld, Hooe, Pevensey, Wartling, Herstmonceux, Hailsham, Hellingly, Chiddingly, and East Hoathly, such part of the parish of Framfield as lies to the east of the road from Pound Green (Hadlow Down Parish) to Halland (via Pound Lane, Pound Farm, Lankhurst Oak, and Eason's Green), and to the south and west of the road from Pound Green to Waldron (via Sharelands), and such part of the parish of Waldron as lies to the south-west of the road from Pound Green to Hailsham (via Waldron, Rockhill Farm and Sharp's Corner), and the borough of Rye, in the administrative county of East Sussex, and the county borough of Hastings.
