While James Edward Morgan was bathing at Lane Cove, Sydney, New South Wales, on the 26th of January, 1912, he was attacked by a shark when some distance from the shore.

In response to his cries for help, Alfred Barlow and William D. McKay, who were in the water, went to his assistance, and succeeded in bringing him to land. While they were actually engaged in doing so, the shark made a second attack on Morgan, and inflicted injuries to which he succumbed.

The rescuers were fully aware of their danger, and incurred very considerable risk in rendering their services.
