

*Movement of Animals through Zone or Area by Railway.*

6. An animal shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Zone or the Area where it is moved through such Zone or Area by railway from a place outside such Zone or Area to another place outside such Zone or Area without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Area.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

9. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

10. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twelve.

*Short Title, &c.*

11. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 17).

SCHEDULE.

*Area Referred to in this Order.*

An Area comprising the parishes of Hallington, Ryal, and Bingfield, such part of the parish of Chollerton as lies to the east of the Roman Road and the road leading from Hexham to Rothbury, and such part of the

parish of Little Bavington as lies to the south of the road from Chollerton to Capheaton (via Steel Rigg and Cocklaw Walls), in the administrative county of Northumberland.

*Zone Referred to in this Order.*

A Zone in the administrative county of Northumberland comprising the parish of Kearsley, and such parts of the parishes of Great Bavington, Little Bavington, Thockrington, Chollerton, Cocklaw, Great Whittington, West Matfen, Ingoe, Kirkheaton, and Capheaton, as lie within the following boundary (but excluding any roads and footpaths forming parts of such boundary, and also excluding such parts of the parishes of Little Bavington and Chollerton as are comprised within the Prohibited Area No. 1a):—

Commencing at the north-western extremity of the parish of Little Bavington at Bab Crag, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction following the public roads and footpaths (via Great Bavington, New Onstead, and Thockrington) to the guide-post at the junction of the roads leading westward and northward from Thockrington and Little Swinburn respectively, proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the latter road to the eastern bank of Colt Crag Reservoir, proceeding thence in a southerly direction along that bank, the eastern banks of Dry Burn and Little Swinburn Reservoir to Woodford Bridge, and thence by Watling-street to the occupation road to Wheathill, thence in a westerly direction following that road and the fence in continuation thereof, to its junction with the fence running southerly to Coal Burn, thence in a southerly direction following that fence to its junction with the fence running north-easterly from Wood Hall, thence following the last-mentioned fence and the occupation road (via Wood Hall) to the public road from Barrasford to Rothbury, thence south-westerly along the last-mentioned road to the guide-post opposite the occupation road to Middle Farm, thence in an easterly direction along the last-mentioned road and the footpath in continuation thereof to the Beck which flows southward into Erring Burn near Keepwick Mill, thence in a southerly direction following the course of that Beck, Erring Burn, and the footpath leading southward from Keepwick Mill to the public road from Cocklaw to Bingfield, thence in an easterly direction following that road to the bridle road leading southward from Errington, thence in a southerly direction along the last-mentioned road to the northern boundary fence of Errington Hill Head, thence in an easterly and southerly direction following that fence, the eastern boundary fence of the same property, the fence running parallel with Redhouse Crag, the fence running northwards from Grottington, and the bridle-road running eastward therefrom to Watling-street at a point near Bewclay, thence in a southerly direction following Watling-street to the northern boundary of the parish of Little Whittington, thence in an easterly direction following that boundary, Bowbridge Burn to Bow Bridge, and the main public road through Great Whittington and Matfen to the public road leading to Low Hall and Fenwick, thence in a northerly and easterly direction following that road to the eastern boundary of the parish of West Matfen, thence in a northerly direction
