The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following translations of two Circulars, dated the 2nd and 7th September respectively, which have been issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste:—

Cases of cholera having been officially ascertained at Damascus, arrivals from the port of Beirut (Syria) will be treated according to Government Circular of the 12th August, 1904, No. 12468, by which the regulations of the International Sanitary Conference of Paris (1903) were published with reference to the Maritime Sanitary Service.

Plague and cholera in endemic form existing in Further India, all arrivals from the ports situated along the littoral from the eastern limit of British India to the limit of China (Singapur included) will be treated according to Government Circular of the 12th August, 1904, No. 12468, by which the Regulations of the International Conference of Paris (1903) were published with reference to the Maritime Sanitary Service.
