The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 24th September, from His Majesty's Minister at Brussels, transmitting the following copy of a Royal Decree, as published in the "Moniteur Belge" of that date, imposing sanitary restrictions on goods coming from Shanghai, owing to an outbreak of cholera at that port:—

Mesures sanitaires.

Le Ministre de l'intérieur,

Vu l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre 1907, prescrivant des mesures sanitaires relativement à l'importation et au transit des marchandises provenant de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales déclarés contaminés de peste ou de choléra;

Vu les cas de choléra qui se sont produits à Shanghai (Chine);

Arrête:

Art. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1 à 6 de l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre 1907 susvisé sont rendues applicables aux provenances de Shanghai.

Art. 2. Les provenances arrivant par mer seront soumises, à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende, de Nieuport, de Zeebrugge, d'Anvers et de Gand, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par le titre I, chapitre II, section III, de la Convention adoptée le 3 décembre 1905 par la Conférence sanitaire internationale de Paris.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under section 9 (1).

BOROUGH OF NEW WINDSOR.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of New Windsor;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of New Windsor, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Borough, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the

Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Borough of New Windsor which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

FLINTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT- AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Orders.

1. The Flintshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the Flintshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2 and 3)—hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 2) and Order (No. 3) respectively—are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

2.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 2), which by Order (No. 3) were applied to Zone II, shall cease to apply to that Zone.

(2.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II; or

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

Movement within Zone I or into Zone I for immediate slaughter.

3.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 2) shall apply to Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts).

(2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone I for immediate slaughter, Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Parts of Zone I.

4. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the parts of Zone I described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as Prohibited Parts).

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone II.

5. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

Movement of Animals through Zones or Prohibited Parts by Railway.

6. For the purposes of this Order, an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone or Prohibited Parts of a Zone where it is moved through such Zone or Prohibited Parts by railway from a place outside such Zone or Prohibited Parts to another place outside such Zone or Prohibited Parts, without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Prohibited Parts.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title, &c.

8. This Order may be cited as the FLINTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH

DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 4), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twelve.

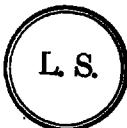
