

to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Chichester.

“ And whereas the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane are consenting jointly to accept the transfer to them of the said advowson or right of patronage for the term of their joint lives and severally to accept the transfer to the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life of the said advowson or right of patronage.

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Charles John, now Bishop of Chichester, is willing to accept the transfer to him and his successors Bishops of Chichester of the said advowson or right of patronage for such estate in fee simple expectant upon the death of the survivor of them the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane as aforesaid and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

“ And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Terwick which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Terwick.

“ Now therefore with the consent as aforesaid of the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Terwick now vested in him the said Charles Thomas Lane as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane to hold as joint tenants for the term of their joint lives and as from the decease of one of them shall be transferred to the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life and as from the decease of the survivor shall be transferred to and be vested in the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and

direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Little Wymondley, in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of St. Albans.

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Little Wymondley is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in Alfred Unwin Heathcote, of Shephalbury, Stevenage, in the county of Hertford, late a Lieutenant-Colonel in Your Majesty's Royal Engineers.

“ And whereas the said Alfred Unwin Heathcote is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Little Wymondley now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edgar, now Bishop of the said diocese of St. Albans, and his successors in the same bishoprick.

“ And whereas the said Edgar, Bishop of St. Albans, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in
