HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate within the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint John, Walthamstow, in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend Herbert Dudley Lampen, Clerk in Holy Orders, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Walthamstow, in the said county and diocese, and, as such vicar or incumbent, the patron of the vicarage of the

said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and with the consent of Sir Thomas Courtenay Theydon Warner, Baronet, of Brettenham Park, Ipswich, in the county of Suffolk, a Companion of Your Majesty's Most Honourable Order of the Bath and a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, as the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respec-tively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one con-solidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, both in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north by the parish of Chingford, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Chingford from the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, crosses the middle of Chingford Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Chingford Road for a distance of forty-five claims or thereabouts to its junction with Wadham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Wadham Road for a distance of fifty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hale End Road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, and extending thence north-eastward along the lastmentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Hale End Road) for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the junction of Hale End Road with the road called Oak Hill, and extending thence northeastward along the middle of Oak Hill for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath and roadway leading through The Sales, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the middle of the said footpath and
