WHEREAS under or by virtue of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries Act, 1903, and an Order of Her late Majesty in Council dated the 30th day of July, 1891, weekly returns of the purchases of British Corn are required to be made under the direction of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in manner provided by the Corn Returns Act, 1882, from such towns not less than one hundred and fifty and not more than two hundred in number as may be from time to time fixed by His Majesty in Council, and the average price of British Corn is required to be from time to time ascertained from those returns and published by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in manner provided by the Corn Returns Act, 1882; and whereas by an Order dated the 26th day of November, 1900, Her late Majesty in Council was pleased to order that the weekly returns of purchases of British Corn should be made from the towns enumerated in the Schedule to that Order; and whereas it has been represented to His Majesty in Council that certain towns should be omitted from such list of returning towns and certain other towns added in substitution and in addition thereto and that the weekly returns of purchases of British Corn should be made from the towns 173 in number enumerated in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that weekly returns of the purchases of British Corn shall, on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, be made from the towns enumerated in the Schedule to this Order.
