NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE AND DISTRICT  
(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE)  
ORDER OF 1912 (No. 7).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Modification of Orders.*

1. The Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2-5) are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Free Movement into and within Zone II.*

2.—(1.) The provisions of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 5)—hereinafter referred to as "Order (No. 5)"—applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto (hereinafter referred to as Zone II) shall cease to apply to that Zone.

(2.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II; or

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

*Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone II.*

3. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority

are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause at least one Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

*Movement within Zone I; Movement into Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.*

4.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 5) shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the Zone I described in the Schedule hereto (except the Prohibited Areas in such Zone described in such Schedule).

(2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Areas) for immediate slaughter, Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

*Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas in Zone I.*

5. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply to the before-mentioned Prohibited Areas, except as hereinafter provided.

*Saving as to Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 6).*

6. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 6) relating to the holding of markets and sales of animals for immediate slaughter in the county boroughs of Gateshead, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and Sunderland, or the movement of animals therefrom to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District.

*Provisions as to Farms on borders of Zones.*

7. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

*Movement of Animals through Zones or Prohibited Areas by Railway.*

8. For the purposes of this Order, an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone or Prohibited Area where it is moved through such Zone or Area by railway from a place outside such Zone or Area to another place outside such Zone or Area, without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Area.

*Commencement.*

9. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and twelve.

*Short Title, etc.*

10. This Order may be cited as the NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 7), and
