MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

STEPNEY UNION.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the twentyfourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the poor within certain Unions, including the Stepney Union; and by Article 182 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas by an Order dated the 29th day of September, 1857, the Poor Law Board suspended, as regards the Medical Officers of the said Union, until that Board should by Order otherwise direct, the operation of certain Articles, including the said Article 182, of the said General Order; and by a further Order dated the 1st day of February, 1893, and issued by Us, the Local Government Board, the suspension of the said Article 182 was removed so far as regards the Medical Officer for the time being of the Workhouse of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision with regard to the suspension of the said Article should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

NOW THEREFORE, We, by this Our Order, suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of the aforesaid Article 182 of the said General Order dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, so far as regards the Medical Officer for the time being of the Workhouse of the said Union.
