Until further notice the town of Constantinople and the Ports in Syria are regarded as infected with cholera.

By Notices previously issued, the following are regarded as infected with cholera:—The town of Cagliari in Sardinia, and the Province of Mersina in Asia Minor.

The Island of Porto Rico is now regarded as free of plague.

By Notices previously issued, the following are regarded as infected with plague:—The Government of Astrachan in Russia, Arabia, the town of Bagdad in Mesopotamia, Persia, India, Burma, Siam and Tonquin, Formosa, the town of Sourabaya in Java with surrounding district, China, Japan, Manchuria, Egypt, Madagascar, the Islands of Réunion and Mauritius, the town of Cape Coast Castle, and the other towns on the Gold Coast of Africa,

the Island of Trinidad, the Ports in Brazil and in Chili, Uruguay and Peru, the town of Guayaquil in Ecuador in South America, the towns of Brisbane, Maryborough, Perth, Fremantle, Geraldton, and Sydney in Australia.

Vessels with cholera or plague patients on board, and bound for Norwegian ports, should be directed by the pilots to the quarantine station on Odderøen, near Christiansand.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and calling at ports in the Prefectures of Nordland, Tromsø, and Finmarken, or using the inner channel between Honningsvaag and Lødingen, should be directed to the quarantine station at Tromsø. But vessels arriving at Hammerfest, Vardö, or Vadsö with single cases of cholera on board may expect, until further notice, that such patients will be received for treatment on shore according to the further directions of the Health Authorities concerned.

KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1912 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Animals into or within Certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

1.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station situate within any borough mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughter-house or bacon factory situate within the same borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, also be moved from any premises situate within any borough mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order to any slaughter-house or bacon factory situate within the same borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1.) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughter-house or bacon factory specified in the Licence by the route therein described, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughter-house or bacon factory shall, so

far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 2).

**ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1912 (No. 2).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Landing.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Board, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain.

(2.) This Order shall not be deemed to prohibit the landing under and in accordance with the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1912 of animals carried on a vessel which has left a port in Ireland on or before the date of this Order.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any animal shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Leeds Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1909, swine may be moved from any premises to which that Order applies to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition either to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse or back to the premises whence they were moved to the exhibition. The swine must be accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Leeds and subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) The swine shall, except while being moved by railway, be conveyed in a float, cart, or van, and by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not exposed at the exhibition.
- (ii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
- (iii.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (iv.) The licence may be in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and if it authorises movement to premises outside the city of Leeds, a copy of it shall be sent by the Inspector granting it to the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate.
