LOCH LONG TORPEDO RANGE.

Declaration under Section 3 of the Official Secrets Act, 1911.

I, The Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by virtue of the power conferred on me by section 3 of the Official Secrets Act, 1911, hereby declare that part of Loch Long used for the purposes of a torpedo range-namely, the part lying to the north of a line drawn due east from Cnap Point, in the county of Argyll, to the opposite coast of the county of Dumbarton, to be a prohibited place for the purposes of the said Act, on the ground that information with respect thereto, or the obstruction thereof, or interference therewith, would be useful to an enemy.

NOTE.-The effect of this Order is not to prevent access to the prohibited area, but to bring within the penal provisions of the Official Secrets Act, 1911, certain acts of espionage, breach of confidence and the like, when committed in, about, or with reference to, the torpedo range.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :---

REGULATIONS respecting Boy Clerks registered for Temporary Employment in Public Departments.

1. Two Registers of Boy Clerks for temporary employment in Public Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. These Registers will contain the names of boys who, being either natural-born or naturalized British subjects, are certified by the Civil Service Commissioners to be of good health and character, and duly qualified under the following Regulations (3 and 4):—One register will contain the names of boys for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns of England, Scotland, and Wales. The other will contain the names of boys for service in Dublin and provincial towns in Ireland.

3. The limits of age are 15 to 16. If an examination begins in one of the first three months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of January in that year. If an examination begins in April or May of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an examination begins in June, July, or August of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of June in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of September in that year.

4. The subjects for examination are : ---

1. Handwriting and Orthography. '

2. Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions.

- 3. English Composition.
- 4. Copying Manuscript.
- And any three of the following, except that not more than two languages may be taken:—
 - 5. Geography.
 - 6. English History.

- 7. Latin.
- 8. French.
 - 9. German.
- . 10. Mathematics.
- 11. Elementary Science.

No candidate will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate, in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency.

5. Open Competitive Examinations for the purpose of testing the qualifications of candidates in the above-mentioned subjects will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners from time to time as may be necessary, and a certain number, regulated by the probable demand from the Public Departments, of those who show sufficient proficiency will be placed upon the Registers kept by the Commissioners, and will be available for employment as their services are required. The competitions for the Irish service will, as a rule, be held at the same time as the competitions for service in Great Britain, and the list of successful candidates for Ireland will be separate from that of the successful candidates for service in Great Britain. Candidates can enter for both com-petitions, when they are held simultaneously, paying only one fee. If successful in both they will be entered on the Register for Great Britain only, or on that for Ireland only, or on both Registers according to their choice.

6. The fee payable for attending an examination will be 5s.

7. Boy Clerks placed on these Registers will be summoned for employment in any of the Public Departments as they are wanted. When not wanted, they will have no claim to employment. Refusing to serve when called upon, except for reasons satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, they will be removed from the Registers. The order in which they may be employed, the Departments to which they may be assigned, and their retention generally on the Registers will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners; but they will be subject to the orders of the Departments in which they are serving during the time of their actual employment, and will be liable to dismissal from them by the authorities thereof, without notice, for inefficiency or misconduct.

Boy Clerks resigning, or procuring their own discharges from Departments, except for sufficient reasons proved to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, will be removed from the Registers.

Their assignment for service will, as a general rule, be according to their order of merit in the examination; but exceptions to this general rule may be made when the engagement offered is very short, or for other sufficient reasons.

8. Boy Clerks will usually be engaged and paid by the week of 39 hours, viz. :--7 hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and 4 hours on Saturdays; and they will be paid 15s. per week during the first year of their service. After a year of approved service, an increase of pay to 16s. a week may be allowed.

In any case of absence without pay a Boy Clerk's increment shall be postponed one day for every day of such absence—absence without pay equally with the interval between two successive engagements not being reckoned as service for any purpose contemplated by the Regulations.

Boy Clerks may also be engaged and paid by the hour at the rate of 41d. per hour during their first year of service; and at the rate of 5d. per hour thereafter. Any who may be ingaged by the week, and who may be required to attend for more than $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, or more than 41 hours on Saturday, will be paid at the hourly rate for the overtime attendance in excess of the normal attendance for such But in no case must overtime attendance dav. exceed 6 hours in any one week. They may also be paid by the piece at such rates as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

9. No service in the capacity of Boy Cler κ will confer any claim to superannuation or compensation allowance; and Boy Clerks w.ll. not be retained, as such, after they shall have reached the age of 18,* subject to the following provisos:—(1) Boy Clerks who have had no opportunity of entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships after reaching the age of $17\frac{1}{2}$, may be retained until the next Competition takes place, and, provided they enter the Competition, until the announcement of the result, and for not more than one month afterwards. (2) Boy Clerks who reach the age of 18 after entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained until the announcement of the result, and for not more than one month afterwards. (3) A Boy Clerk who has been declared successful in a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained as a Boy Clerk until he is assigned to a vacant post as Assistant Clerk, unless he be rejected by the Civil Service Commissioners as not duly qualified in respect of age, health, or character for the permanent situation.

10. If a public holiday, on which the office is closed, fall within the period of a Boy Clerk's engagement, he may be paid in respect of it as for a working day. Boy Clerks may, with the consent of the Department in which they are serving, or if not at the time serving, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be allowed holidays, with full pay in the proportion of 12 days a year. No Boy Clerk shall be allowed to take more than 12 days' leave under these conditions between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of December.

Holiday pay can only be allowed for holidays actually taken, not for days on which the Boy Clerk is drawing pay in respect of employment in any capacity in the Public Service.

11. Boy Clerks who may fall ill while serving in any Department, and whose illness may be attested by medical certificate to the satisfaction of the authorities of such Department; may be allowed sick-leave at the full rate of pay for the official day, provided that no Boy Clerk shall be paid for sick-leave for more than 36 days within any one year, exclusive of public holidays.

12. Except in conformity with Regulations 10, 11, 14, and 15, Boy Clerks will only receive pay for the hours, or parts of hours, during which they actually attend.

13. Persons who have entered upon or com-

pleted a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, are not eligible for employment as Boy Clerks until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

14. If any case of infectious disease should occur in the house where a Boy Clerk is living, he must immediately report the fact to the Officer under whom he is employed, and must, if required, at once discontinue his attendance. In cases of such enforced absence from his employment, it is in the discretion of the Head of the Department in which he has been serving to allow the Boy Clerk full pay at the usual rate for the period for which it is medically certified that his attendance at the office would be likely to be dangerous to his colleagues.

15. In any year in which an open Competition for situations as Assistant Clerk (Abstractor Class) in the Civil Service, for situations as Officer of Customs and Excise or for Clerkships of the Second Division is held, a Boy Clerk who obtains from the Head of the Department in which he is serving leave of absence to attend such Examination may also, at the discretion of the Head of the Department, be allowed pay, at the usual rate, for the days during which he is attending the Examination.

16. Service Marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service in the capacity of Boy Clerk, subject to a maximum of eight such periods,* will be allowed to Candidates attending Examinations for the situations of—

Clerk in the Second Division of the Civil Service,

Officer of Customs and Excise,

who are serving or have served as Boy Clerks, provided they shall have rendered not less than six months' approved service in that capacity; but the number of marks to be allowed for each period may be different at successive examinations.

17. In the promotions of permanent Civil Servants [Assistant Clerks (Abstractor Class) and others] under Clause 45 of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910, not less than one year's and not more than two years' approved service as Boy Clerk may be allowed to reckon towards the six years' established service required by the said clause.

THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (SPECIAL ORDERS ACCELERATION) ORDER (No. 2), 1912, made under Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55), by the Joint Committee established under that Act, acting alone and also acting jointly

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things enacted that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing into operation Part I of the Act, the Insurance Commissioners with the consent of the Treasury may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that part of the Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by virtue of various provisions of the Act and of the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912, the Joint Committee of the several bodies of Commissioners established under the Act acting either alone or jointly with those bodies have power to make Special Orders for various purposes of the Act:

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And whereas the said Joint Committee acting either alone or jointly as aforesaid have since the commencement of the Act published notice of their proposal to make certain Special Orders under the Act, and may hereafter publish notice of their proposal to make certain further Special Orders under the Act, but unless special provision is made in manner provided by this Order the Special Orders in respect of which notice has been or may be published cannot, by reason of the provisions of section 113 of the Act, and the Ninth Schedule to the Act, come into force before the expiration of a period of at least fifty-one days after the publication of the draft Order:

And whereas it is expedient for bringing Part I. of the Act into operation that the Joint Committee acting either alone or jointly as aforesaid, as the case may be, should in any case in which they have given notice of their proposal to make a Special Order be enabled to make the Order to come into operation as a Provisional Order before the expiration of the said period:

And whereas by the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912, it is amongst other things provided that the said Joint Committee shall exercise and perform either alone or jointly with the several bodies of Commissioners as the case may require such of the powers and duties of those bodies under section 78 of the Act as may be necessary to enable the Joint Committee to exercise and perform the several powers and duties of the Joint Committe under the Act and those Regulations:

And whereas by virtue of sections 80, 81, and 82 of the Act respectively the Scottish Insurance Commissioners, the Irish Insurance Commissioners, and the Welsh Insurance Commissioners for the purpose of carrying Part I. of the Act into effect in Scotland, Ireland, and Wales respectively, have the like powers and duties as are by the Act imposed on the Insurance Commissioners;

Now, therefore, the Joint Committee acting alone and also acting jointly with the Insurance Commissioners, the Scottish Insurance Commissioners, the Irish Insurance Commissioners, and the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and by the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912, with the consent of the Treasury hereby order as follows:---

1.—(1.) In any case in which the Joint Committee acting either alone or jointly with the several bodies of Commissioners or with any one or more of those bodies have published notice of their proposal to make a Special Order under the Act, they may, if they certify that for the .purpose of bringing into operation Part I. of the Act it is expedient that the Special Order should come into operation forthwith, make the Order to come into operation forthwith as a Provisional Special Order, but such a Provisional Special Order shall only continue in force until the Special Order has been made in accordance with the provisions of section 113 of the Act and the Ninth Schedule to the Act.

(2.) Any Provisional Special Order made in pursuance of this Order shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as may be after it is made, and if an address is presented to His Majesty by either House of Parliament within the next subsequent twenty-one days on which that House has sat next after any such Provisional Special Order is laid before it, praying that the Order may be annulled, His Majesty in Council may annul the Order, and it shall thenceforth be void, but without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done thereunder.

And whereas by Article 153 of the General Consolidated Order provision was made for the. appointment by the Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the Workhouse, includ-ing the office of nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of that Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas by an Order issued by Us, the Local Government Board, and dated the 19th day of December, 1894, We directed that the provisions of the General Consolidated Order, amongst other Orders, should apply to and be in force in the Stoke-upon-Trent Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of: nurse at the Workhouse of the Stoke-upon-Trent Union:

THEREFORE, We, the Local NOW Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, nereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the General Consolidated Order, as applied as aforesaid to the Stoke-upon-Trent Union, if the Guardians of the Poor of that Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of nurse at the Workhouse of the Union, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to those nurses, and We approve that statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the General Consolidated Order of a person to hold the office of nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows :----

(1) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any superintendent 'nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

(2) A person who has not reached the age

of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of probationary nurse.

THEREFORE, We, the Local NOW Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said James Keogh (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows :-

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the accounts of the following authorities and their officers, namely

(6) The Joint Committee appointed to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board by the Parish Councils of the Township of Amington and Stoney Delph, and the Parishes of Polesworth and Wilnecote and Castle Liberty.

(7) Such other authorities whose accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose districts

or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may here-! after prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

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ARTICLE III.—The district in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Staffordshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of the authorities mentioned in paragraphs (4), (5), and (6) of Article I. of this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such authority as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of the said Article.

Modification of Orders.

1. The Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order ") and the Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 3), here-inafter referred to as Order (No. 3), are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Holding of Markets, Sales or Exhibitions in the Zone of Animals for Immediate Slaughter. Slaughter.

2.~ -(1.) A market, sale or exhibition of animals may be held on any premises situate in the Zone described in the First Schedule to Order No. 3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone "), if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market, sale or exhibition will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market, sale or exhibition is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market, sale or exhibition authorised under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed for sale at any such market, sale or exhibition may be moved out of the market, saleyard or place of exhibition if it is accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, saleyard or place of exhibition is situate, but only to a slaughter-house in the Zone which shall be specified in the licence.

(4.) A Movement Licence shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the movement thereto will not involve movement on a road which is not in the Zone.,

Movement to Markets, Sales or Exhibitions.

3.--(1.) An animal may be moved by rail-way or by water without a Licence from pre-mises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway-station or landing-place situate within the Zone; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway-station or landing-place to a market, sale or exhibition authorised under the preceding Article if it is accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railwaystation or landing-place is situate.

(2.) An animal may also be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a market, sale or exhibition authorised under the preceding Article if it is accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, saleyard or place of exhibition is situate.

(3.) For any other movement of an animal from premises within the Zone to a market, sale or exhibition authorised under the preceding Article a Movement Licence may be granted under Article 3 of Order (No. 3).

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twelve.
